Michif Bilingual Program

St. Michael Community School is the first school in Saskatchewan to offer Bilingual programing for our Michif Language (Métis Language). We offer programing in grades:

Kindergarten – all day everyday Grade 1

Grade 2

Catholic Faith-based learning Grow in your Métis identity through language and culture Land-based learning Transportation provided Nutrition support (Breakfast, lunch, and Snack)

Pre-Kindergarten and Kindergarten

Pre-Kindergarten is now full day Monday and Wednesday. The first two weeks of school the Pre-k teacher will be setting up a time to meet with families in their home or at school. Staggered start days begin September 12 and September 14, your teacher will tell you your start day at the meeting.

Kindergarten is full day, every day again this year and we will begin with staggered start. September 1(am) and September 6 will be last names starting with A-K and September 2 will be last names starting with L-Z. September 7 will be a regular school day for ALL kindergarten students.

Cell Phone policy

We request that students <u>DO NOT</u> bring valuable items to school. WE ALSO DISCOURAGE STUDENTS FROM BRINGING CELL PHONES AND OTHER ELECTRONIC DEVICES.

Cell phones and electronic devices are not permitted during the school day (8:30 a.m. to 3:30 p.m.) we provide all the technology required for learning.

Students understand that if they do not follow these expectations, they may have the device confiscated. Students choosing not to follow these expectations, repeatedly, will have their cell phone taken away and a parent may have to come pick it up. Dress Code

Over the past few years, the more prescriptive aspects of a dress code have evolved into something closer to a case-by-case examination of "appropriate dress guidelines." As such, we offer the following guidelines to outline our beliefs:

• That we can rely on the good judgement of parents and caregivers to determine the clothing children should wear to school.

• That how we dress affects our attitude and behavior. Students and staff are encouraged to dress for success in their roles as learners and professionals in a Catholic education setting.

 \cdot That weather, activity, age and many different variables cause great variation in what can be deemed reasonable and respectful.

 \cdot That clothing with vulgar language or themes of racism, sexism, drug, alcohol and tobacco will not be allowed.

 \cdot That students have the clothing necessary to participate in school activities and outdoor recesses.

• If a student's clothing choice is questionable, a conversation will ensue, and the student may be asked to change their attire.

Prekindergarten 2022-2023

Prekindergarten is a Ministry of Education funded program for 3 and 4-year-old children. A holistic approach is foundational to the Prekindergarten program. This means that all aspects of a child's life are considered within the program – the family, the community and his/her language, culture, social-motional, physical, intellectual and spiritual development. Each classroom environment focuses on play and promotes hands on learning opportunities. Prekindergarten runs 6 days a week either mornings or a riternoons (depending on the school) with some Fridays dedicated to family days, home visits and class outings. There are 16 students per class, 1 teacher and 1 EA-8:1 ratio. Nutritional snacks are provided to

students each day

Families need to fill out an application for potential program placement. Due to the limited availability of Prekindergarten programs, children and their families are selected for the program to ensure the most vulnerable children are served based on Ministry criteria.
