# **DROP OFF AND PICK UP TIMES**

### **STUDENT ABSENCES**



**Edsby** will be used to <u>report student absences</u>. Edsby can be accessed <u>online</u>, or on mobile apps available in the <u>App Store</u> and <u>Google Play</u>.

Here are some short help videos to demonstrate some of Edsby's features.

**School Bundle messaging** tool is a new service and will be used to inform you of unreported student absences.

No app is needed. There is no need to edit settings or set notifications. Just make sure the school office has up-to-date contact information for you to receive voice calls, emails and/or SMS text messages.

Communication will come from the email noreply-gscs@schoolbundle.ca (listed as Greater Saskatoon Catholic Schools) and the phone number 1-306-400-6811, so please make sure that information is in your contacts so it doesn't end up in your spam/junk folder.

As a reminder: all students who arrive late need to check in at the office for a late slip. Also, if your child is leaving early, they need to let the office know before leaving the school.

# **VOLUNTEER CRIMINAL RECORD CHECK**

If you plan to volunteer in your child's classroom or other areas of the school, a Criminal Record Check form needs to be completed and taken to the City Police for approval. Stop by the office to get a registration form. Criminal Record Checks need to be renewed annually so if renewed in September it will be good for the whole school year.

Anaphylaxis is a medical condition that causes a severe reaction to specific foods and can result in


