ADMIN MESSAGE

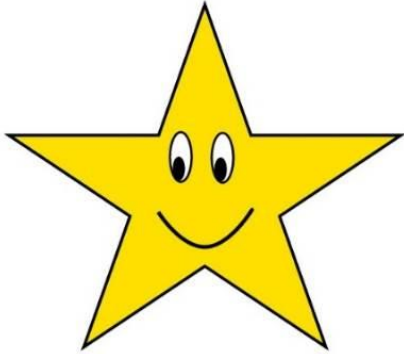

DROP OFF AND PICK UP TIMES

We have noticed a number of students being dropped off early in the mornings and picked up late after school. It is expected that **students should not arrive any earlier than 8:25 am and that they are picked up or walk home following dismissal at 3:10 pm**. The exception to this is when they are under teacher supervision to receive extra help with work. Arrangements with the Before and After School Program need to be made for students arriving before this time or needing to be picked up later. EXTERIOR DOORS

Due to safety, all exterior doors will be locked, except for the main front door, during the school day from 9:00 am until 3:00 pm. Students and visitors are reminded that entrance to the school throughout the day will be through the main entrance only. **All visitors should report to the office.**

OUTSIDE FOOTWEAR

Parents, students and staff are reminded to remove any wet outside footwear when entering the school. This will ensure the floors will be kept dry and clean for those who do remove their footwear. Thank you for keeping our school safe and clean.

MEDICATION POLICY

The School Division policies outline appropriate procedures dealing with a variety of emergency situations, which includes administration of emergency medical assistance or medication. Prior to administering medication (prescription or non prescription). It is stated that a letter from the child's parent/ guardian and a letter from the physician is to be received at the school. If this applies to your child, please contact the school for more information.

ALLERGY ALERT



We have a number of students at our school that are **highly allergic to peanuts and nut products**. Anaphylaxis is a medical condition that causes a severe reaction to specific foods and can result in death within minutes. Because of the seriousness of this danger, we ask that you are careful to avoid sending these foods or foods containing them to school. A reminder that if you have a child that needs medical treatment that is life threatening, please contact the principal at the school. Thanks for your understanding and cooperation.

TRAFFIC SAFETY

For the safety of our students, please do not use the staff parking lots as a drop off or pick up zone. When dropping off your children, please use Haultain Avenue and drop them off by the gym doors.

SCHOOL ZONES

- The speed limit in school zones is 30 kms/hr
- U-turns are prohibited
- Parking is allowed in designated areas only
- Stopping or parking is not allowed in a school bus loading zone
- Jaywalking is prohibited; pedestrians must cross at intersections or marked crosswalks

ADVENT PRAYER

Lord God, open our hearts to the joyful hope of this Advent Season. Give us hearts like Mary's – hearts of patient expectation, hearts full of faith and wonder, hearts made glad with joy and hope. As we journey through Advent help us turn our expectant waiting into readiness to welcome Him in all we meet.

ADVENT WREATH



The Advent wreath is rich in Christian symbolism. It is made of evergreen boughs formed in a circle. The Advent wreath holds four candles: three purple and one pink; some wreaths also have a white candle in the centre. The four candles represent the four Sundays of Advent. The first candle is purple and represents HOPE; the second candle is purple and represents PEACE; the third candle is pink and represents JOY (Gaudete Sunday); the fourth candle is purple and represents LOVE.

An Ancient Tradition

The Advent wreath has its roots in traditions practiced by the early Germanic peoples. As winter's short and dark days began growing brighter, they would celebrate the coming light by making wreaths of green and lighting fires. When these people became Christian, they began using wreaths in their churches, to celebrate the coming birth of Jesus, Light of the World.

The Circle: No Beginning or End



The wreath is formed in a circle, which has no beginning or end. This reminds us of our God, who is eternal -without beginning or end. The shape of the Advent wreath also represents the gift of eternal life won for us by Jesus' dying and rising to new life.

Green: The Colour of Life and Hope

The wreath is made of evergreen boughs. Green is the colour of *life*. It reminds us of the newborn life of Jesus our Saviour. It also reminds us of the gift of new and eternal life we received at baptism. The colour green is also the colour of *hope*. Christian hope tells us that we can build a better world by living the Good News of Jesus' Gospel. Christian hope also tells us that nothing can overcome God's love for us in Christ.

Candles: Light of the World, Faith



The candles represent *light*. Jesus, the Light of the world, who shines in our darkness, and shows us the way to the Father. The candle also symbolizes God's gift of *faith*. By faith, we say "I trust you" to God; by faith, we know we are God's beloved children; by faith, we walk with Jesus as members of his body, the Church.

Purple: Royalty and Penance

There are three purple candles: one for the first, the second and fourth weeks of Advent. Purple is the symbol of *royalty* and *penance*. Purple reminds us of Jesus' coming as Prince of Peace, and King. Our Advent prayer, acts of kindness and self-denial help make our hearts ready to welcome Jesus our Lord, as he comes to us on Christmas Day.

Pink: Joy



Pink is the colour of *joy*. The pink candle is used in third Sunday of Advent, called *Joyful* Sunday (*Gaudete* Sunday in Latin). On this day, people traditionally relax their penances and joyfully sing the Gloria at mass as a foretaste of the coming joy of the Christmas season.

White: Jesus

The white candle at the centre of the Advent wreath is lit on Christmas day. The white candle represents Jesus, the pure and spotless Lamb of God, born of Mary to lead us to the house of the Father. He is the fullness of our Christmas joy!
