6. <u>Physical Education Safety Guidelines</u>

The Greater Saskatoon Catholic Schools' Physical Education Safety Guidelines Handbook states that students are to "remove all jewelry before participating in physical education activities." Jewelry includes ear studs, nose rings as well as other body jewelry such as watches, rings and hanging jewelry.

7. Student Attendance

To be academically successful, students must attend classes regularly and promptly. Students, parents, and teachers must work jointly to ensure regular and prompt attendance and continual progress in all courses.

Parents are responsible for ensuring their child's regular attendance. Please notify the school prior to the start of classes if your child is going to be absent that day. You have two convenient ways to report absences, and you can report planned absences in advance:

- a. Use EDSBY to indicate when your child will be absent. If you do not have an EDSBY account, you will be sent an invitation to set one up at the beginning of the school year. It is very important to set up an EDSBY account as this is where you will report absences, view marks and report cards, see upcoming exam or assignment dates and communicate with your child's teachers.
- b. For attendance reporting and/or attendance information call 306-659-7506. Voicemail is available twenty-four hours a day and will record your attendance information if the phone line is busy.

8. Extended Absences

Regular student attendance is very important to complete the outcomes for each curriculum. Please do your best to plan for vacations at the designated breaks, as extended absences may impact your child's academic success. Options such as cyber school may need to be considered for extended absences.

9. Safe Learning Environment

Everyone at Bishop James Mahoney High School has the right to enjoy a safe environment in and around the school. We are committed to building and maintaining a positive educational environment in which everyone's rights are respected and protected. In a school, all individuals have a right to expect and a responsibility to create an appropriate and safe learning environment. The Education Act stipulates that students are accountable to the school on their way to and from home, during the school day (including the lunch hour) and during school-sponsored activities such as field trips, social or sporting events. Unacceptable behaviours are recognized as serious and will not be allowed. They require immediate action to determine cause and consequences and to provide opportunities for learning appropriate behaviour. Parents will be informed of the issues and the consequences when situations occur. If students encounter a problem related to safety, they should immediately seek the assistance of their teachers, school counsellors or administrators.

10. Photographs and Student Cards

Photographers will be at the school on **Tuesday, August 29, from 8:30 a.m. – 3:00 p.m.** and **Wednesday, August 30 from 8:30 a.m. – 3:00 p.m.** A reminder that the school dress code is in effect for school photos. If dressed inappropriately, your photo will not appear in the yearbook. All students will be photographed for student cards and the yearbook (optional cost included in the student fees). Students will receive a photo package detailing purchase options. Please note that there is NO obligation to purchase a photo package. **Photo retake day is scheduled for Thursday, September 28.**

11. Cafeteria

The cafeteria operates on a non-profit basis. Meals are provided at reasonable cost. We are a nutrition positive school. Reloadable meal cards are available to purchase. Parents and students may purchase cards or reload cards in the cafeteria from 8:00-8:25 daily.
