Grade 11 and Grade 12 Indigenous students - Verna J. Kirkness Education Foundation

Program: The VJKF Program offers Indigenous (First Nation, Métis, and Inuit) high school students* an opportunity to spend one week conducting research in the fields of science, technology, engineering, or mathematics. As one of our Kirkness Scholars, you'll work with university professors and graduate students from one of our partner universities researching a specific topic of interests. All our students are given an opportunity to let us know which areas of STEM research interests them the most! All expenses are paid if a student is accepted into the VJKF Program. Accepted students will be assigned to a university and week, and provided with the list of research opportunities at that university. Deadline for applications is December 15. Evan Thomas Memorial Scholarship: Candidates shall be a graduating Grade 12 student from any high school within the Saskatoon Public School system or the Greater Saskatoon Catholic School system who intend to pursue post-secondary studies, Candidates shall demonstrate team leadership, athletic qualities in a team sport, and academic proficiency. Scholarships needing School Nomination: In order to be considered for the following scholarships, you must be nominated by your school. If you wish to be considered for school nomination, please fill out the application and **return it to Student Services** by **Friday, December 15**. For more information and for the nomination application, please see Student Services.

1. **Grade 12 Students - Schulich Leader Scholarships** are the largest and most prestigious undergraduate Science, Technology, Engineering and Math (STEM) scholarships in Canada, with a value of up to \$120,000 per award. This scholarship was established to encourage our best and brightest students to be the next generation of entrepreneurial-minded, technology innovators. Schulich Leader Scholarships is open to all Canadian high schools with graduating students planning to pursue an undergraduate degree in an eligible STEM program at one of our 20 partner universities.
2. **Grade 12 Students - Queen's Diamond Jubilee Scholarship**. This \$1000 scholarship is awarded to grade 12 students who will be attending a post-secondary institution in the fall. A selection committee will review all nominations based on the following criteria: school and/or community-based leadership; responsibilities outside of school; financial support needed; and academic performance.
3. **Grade 11 Students - Prince of Wales and Duchess of Cornwall Scholarship**. This \$500 scholarship is awarded to grade 11 students to assist in finishing their grade 12 school year. A selection committee will consider four student qualities: school and/or community-based leadership; responsibilities outside of school; financial support needed; and academic performance.
