Nutrien Indigenous Youth Financial Management Awards: There is a great demand within Indigenous communities and off-reserve for Indigenous financial management professionals and there are many opportunities for those who want to pursue this career path and many sources of assistance. However, very few of our young people are pursuing an education in financial management after high school. That is why AFOA Canada and Nutrien have come together to offer the Annual Nutrien Indigenous Youth Financial Management Awards. Recipients attend AFOA Canada's National Conference and participate in a special Youth program designed to introduce youth to careers in Indigenous finance and management, and they become eligible for a scholarship of up to \$5,000. Scholarships needing School Nomination: In order to be considered for the following scholarships, you must be nominated by your school. If you wish to be considered for school nomination, please fill out the application and <u>return it to Student Services</u> by <u>Friday</u>, <u>December 15</u>. - 1. **Grade 12 Students Schulich Leader Scholarships** are the largest and most prestigious undergraduate Science, Technology, Engineering and Math (STEM) scholarships in Canada, with a value of up to \$120,000 per award. This scholarship was established to encourage our best and brightest students to be the next generation of entrepreneurial-minded, technology innovators. Schulich Leader Scholarships is open to all Canadian high schools with graduating students planning to pursue an undergraduate degree in an <u>eligible STEM program</u> at one of our 20 partner universities.
- 2. Grade 12 Students Queen's Diamond Jubilee Scholarship. This \$1000 scholarship is awarded to grade 12 students who will be attending a post-secondary institution in the fall. A selection committee will review all nominations based on the following criteria: school and/or community-based leadership; responsibilities outside of school; financial support needed; and academic performance.
- 3. Grade 11 Students Prince of Wales and Duchess of Cornwall Scholarship. This \$500 scholarship is awarded to grade 11 students to assist in finishing their grade 12 school year. A selection committee will consider four student qualities: school and/or community-based leadership; responsibilities outside of school; financial support needed; and academic performance.

Please note that applications to the Faculty of Education also require a small personal statement which is included in the application. If students do want to apply for Nursing, they can do so at mysasknursingdegree.ca. However, if they want to take advantage of the reduced application fee period, they can apply for their second-choice program with us, get their U of R Student ID number within a couple weeks, then apply to Saskatchewan Polytechnic for the Nursing program for a free application fee!
