Opportunities for students entering Usask: ST. THOMAS MORE College

If you're a grade 12 student planning to attend the University of Saskatchewan (USask) this fall and want access to even MORE benefits, St. Thomas More College (STM) could be an option for you! STM is a Catholic liberal arts college at USask and works in partnership with the college of Arts & Science to provide over 225 additional credit course options to USask students! All USask students have access to STM courses, study spaces, events, and student clubs.

Arts and Science students can additionally declare as STM students to gain even more benefits through STM college. Declaring does not restrict your program or cost extra but rather provides extra benefits for you through the college. STM-declared students can apply for STM scholarships and bursaries, have access to student support at the college (like academic advising services) and can build more connections by being involved in student leadership and other clubs in a smaller college on campus.

To declare as an STM student, simply check off the box on your application to USask that says you'd like to declare! Or declare at any time through the STM channel on your <u>student</u> <u>PAWS account</u>. That's it! Now, you're a STM student and USask student at the same time! (Follow the QR code to declare)

STM scholarships/bursaries have new application dates! Applications for scholarships for entering students are open from May 1st to August 8th, and bursaries open August 11th to October 1st.
