

Scholarships needing School Nomination: In order to be considered for the following scholarships, you must be nominated by your school. If you wish to be considered for school nomination, please fill out the application and <u>return it to Student Services</u> by <u>Tuesday</u>, <u>December 17</u>. - Grade 12 Students <u>Schulich Leader Scholarships</u> are the largest and most prestigious undergraduate Science, Technology, Engineering and Math (STEM) scholarships in Canada, with a value of up to \$120,000 per award. This scholarship was established to encourage our best and brightest students to be the next generation of entrepreneurialminded, technology innovators. Schulich Leader Scholarships is open to all Canadian high schools with graduating students planning to pursue an undergraduate degree in an <u>eligible STEM program</u> at one of our 20 partner universities.
- Grade 12 Students <u>Queen's Diamond Jubilee Scholarship</u>. This \$1000 scholarship is awarded to grade 12 students who will be attending a post-secondary institution in the fall. A selection committee will review all nominations based on the following criteria: school and/or community-based leadership; responsibilities outside of school; financial support needed; and academic performance.
- Grade 11 Students Prince of Wales and Duchess of Cornwall Scholarship. This \$500 scholarship is awarded to grade 11 students to assist in finishing their grade 12 school year. A selection committee will consider four student qualities: school and/or community-based leadership; responsibilities outside of school; financial support needed; and academic performance.
