There is currently a high demand for certified early childhood educators (ECEs) to work in regulated childcare. The province is increasing the supply of qualified educators and creating opportunities for Saskatchewan residents through bursaries aimed at full-time students working towards an ECE diploma in 2025-26. Bursaries for ECE study are available at Saskatchewan Polytechnic, Collège Mathieu and Saskatchewan Indian Institute of Technologies (SIIT) as a result of investments under the *Canada-Saskatchewan Canada-Wide Early Learning and Child Care Agreement*.

Saskatchewan Polytechnic is providing bursaries to Year Two ECE diploma students. Students will receive a \$16,000 bursary paid in two \$8,000 installments, one in October and again upon successful completion of their final practicum.
