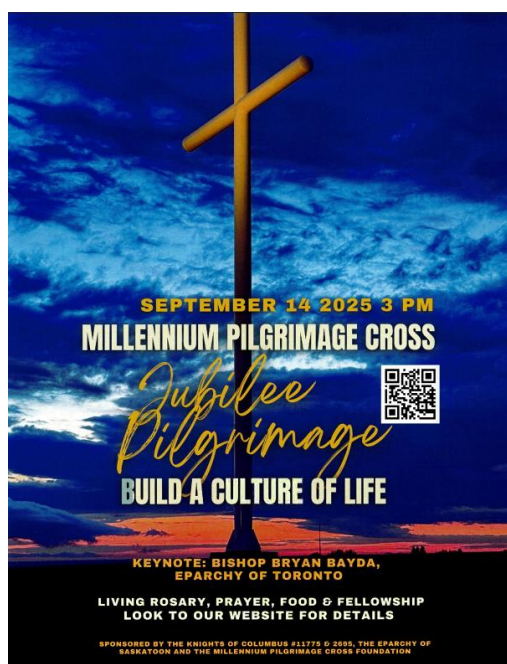
### In Case You Missed It:

This is how the Ministry will connect you with My Creds (the site from which you will be sharing your Official Transcript).
