4. Program Changes

Please note that we anticipate more disruptions than normal with schedule changes. Some students may experience a change in their schedule after the first week in September. We will do our best to minimize these changes; however, adjustments may need to be made to accommodate increased enrolment.

During registration in the spring, students were advised to make sure they knew which courses they wanted in their schedule. Schedule changes will be made for **educational reasons only**. This form will be open on August 28 and the deadline for course changes requests is September 7. Please continue to follow your schedule until you have received an email from an Administrator or Counsellor indicating a timetable change. Not all change requests will be accommodated due to class sizes and reason for the change.

^{**}Please note that city transit special bus service will only be available in the morning prior to the 8:30 a.m. start time and at the end of the day following the 3:10 p.m. dismissal. Students who use the special buses must make alternate transportation arrangements after the 11:30 a.m. dismissal and before the 12:25 p.m. start. **

5. Student Access to the School

The school is open on regular school days for students until 4:00 pm. Families should arrange for their children to be picked up by 4:00 pm unless they have a planned extracurricular activity with a staff supervisor.

6. Locks & Lockers

Grade 9 students will receive a lock and locker on September 5th. Students who are not in Grade 9 and new to Holy Cross can request a locker through this form: New Students Grade 10-12 Locker Request Form. Students in Grade 11 – 12 who currently have a locker will continue to use the same locker as last year. Grade 10 students who wish to have a locker will also need to request one on the form. The form will be open until end of day Sept. 7th. All students must use the blue locks given out by the school. Grade 9 students will also receive a green lock from their Physical Education teacher which is to be used on Phys Ed lockers only. Students who have misplaced their lock or whose lock no longer works may purchase a new lock from the main office. Locks not purchased from the school will be removed by Administration.

7. School Supplies

Students should come to school equipped with a small supply of pens, pencils, binder(s), and paper. Teachers will advise students of other specific needs for their classes.

8. School Communication

The school's web site can be found at www.gscs.ca/hch. On our web page you will find the daily student notices, a calendar of events, the school handbook, and other important information about Holy Cross High School

Edsby will be our primary form of communication. It will be used:

- for day-to-day information from your student's teachers and the school,
- to report student absences,
- to share evidence of student learning and access to progress reports/report cards,
- to share classroom news,
- to book three-way conferences, and
- to facilitate easy communication between parents/caregivers and teachers.

9. Student Attendance

To be academically successful, students must attend classes regularly and promptly. Parents and guardians play a major role in ensuring regular attendance for their child. Please notify the school prior to the start of classes if your child is going to be absent that day.

10. Extended absences

Regular student attendance is very important to complete the course outcomes and be successful in classes. Please do your best to plan vacations at the designated breaks, as extended absences may impact your child's academic success. If a student will be away for 5 or more days of school, they must fill out an extended absence form in advance. They are to obtain an Extended Absence form from the Attendance Secretary and talk to each of their subject teachers to determine what work will be missed and as such gather information to keep up with the material.

11. **HC CSCC**

The Holy Cross Catholic School Community Council (HCCSCC) will hold their Annual General Meeting on Tuesday, September 19th at 7:00 pm in the Holy Cross Library. All members of the Holy Cross Catholic school community are invited to attend. 12. Cafeteria Services

Regular Cafeteria Services begin Wednesday, September 6th, 2023. The cafeteria operates on a non-profit basis and provides meals at a reasonable cost.

13. Yearbook

If your child is wishing to receive a yearbook for the 2023-2024 school year, there will be an option in the MySchoolBucks store to be charged \$32.00 on their student fees. The yearbook is in full color. If they choose not to purchase a yearbook, they will not be charged for it. The decision to receive a yearbook is a final decision as books are ordered according to what has been paid for. If your child does not pick up their previous year's yearbook by the end of September the following school year, it will be resold.

14. Student Fees

School fee invoices will be issued through MySchoolBucks mid-September. Fees are payable to the main office by November 1st, 2023. If this is not possible, please speak with Mrs. D'Souza in the Main Office to make alternate arrangements for a partial payment schedule. If there are difficulties, please see Ms. Hayes. Payment can be made in the form of cash, cheque or debit at the main office, or by credit card by signing up for the MySchoolBucks App. Please click the link for more information: www.myschoolbucks.ca

We are currently updating our course fees and will be sending out more information regarding amounts in mid-September.

Textbook Fee

Textbooks are supplied with no charge to students; however, students will be charged for any lost or damaged textbooks at the end of each semester.

15. Band Instrument Rental Fee

Band students who rent instruments from GSCS will see this rental fee on the Student Fee statement in September.

16. Fee Refund

No refunds of student activity fees will be made. Refunds of course fees will be prorated after 15 days into the course up to 35 days. Students who withdraw from a course for which fees have been paid must speak to the main office regarding a refund.

17. Other Fees

Athletic fees are under the jurisdiction of the Saskatoon Secondary Schools Athletic Directorate. Students participating on an athletic team will be charged \$20.00 for each respective athletic team. The fee is payable to the coach once the student has been selected to the team. There is no refund of this fee; however, there may be additional fees depending on the sport.

Teams or clubs that choose to travel must cover the cost of the excursion, including the teacher supervisor cost. This type of excursion is completely voluntary. Teams or clubs that choose to purchase team apparel take full responsibility for these voluntary purchases.

Each year, student activity fees are based on the needs of the extracurricular program of the school. At the end of an academic year, a surplus may occur. These funds will be directed by the SRC for special projects of the school in the following academic year.
