Outdoor play and learning space - You may have noticed a new fenced area that has recently appeared at the back of the school. We've received a few questions and wanted to take a moment to share its purpose and our vision for the space. This fenced area will be developed into an outdoor play and learning space, primarily for our younger students. It will also serve as a safe and supportive recess environment for students who benefit from a smaller, more structured area. We're excited to create a space that is both fun and inspiring as we begin the new school year!

To help bring this vision to life, we are reaching out to our generous school community. As you open your garages and sheds this spring and summer, we invite you to consider donating gently used or new items that could enhance this space. These contributions will help us build a warm, inclusive, and creative environment for our students.

Suggested Items:

Permanent Features:

- Solid playhouse for imaginative play (not for climbing)
- Small climbing apparatus like a small dome
- Mud kitchen for sensory and role-playing activities
- Sturdy bench suitable for both children and adults
- Enclosed sandbox for safe and creative sensory play
- Chalkboard attached to the fence to encourage fine motor skills and artistic expression

Movable or Seasonal Items:

- Child-sized picnic table for snacks, crafts, and activities
- Water table for sensory exploration
- Weather-resistant art easel for painting and drawing
- Tree stumps for seating, balancing, or imaginative play
- River rocks or small landscape stones for tactile exploration
- Durable outdoor vehicles push toys or ride-ons
- Heavy-duty sand and water toys buckets, scoops, molds, etc.
- Old metal pots, pans, and utensils for mud kitchen use
- Planters for gardening projects
- Artificial Turf (fake grass)

This initiative has been supported and encouraged by our CSCC (Catholic School Community Council), and we are so grateful for their partnership. With your help, we hope to launch this space in the fall as a joyful, nature-inspired environment that nurtures both play and well-being. Make Sure Your Child Has All of the Vaccines They Need

We are reaching out for your support for the upcoming 2025/2026 school fall immunization program for students going into **grade 1** (not provided at schools, but by appointment at a public health office) and students going into **grades 6 & 8** (provided at school).

To deliver this program effectively, we kindly request that all parents/guardians of children who are new to Saskatchewan or Canada and have not yet received immunizations in Saskatchewan, complete the form on page 2. Please submit this form along with your child's vaccine records to the following email address:

In Saskatchewan, several vaccines are recommended and provided free for children and adults. Immunization schedules can vary between countries and provinces/territories within Canada. 

GENERAL GROUP INFORMATION

Participant Research:

52° North – Youth Empowered is a research project designed to support and promote healthy relationships and prevent gender-based and youth dating violence. It is funded by the Public Health Agency Canada, includes a research component, and is offered to those between 10 and 22 years of age. For the research, we will be asking participants to answer some questions about the project and for feedback on their experience. Some ways we will be collecting information is through surveys and measurement tools provided at different points of the project. Those that complete all the modules of a group will receive a \$20 gift card. Refreshments are provided at each group session.

All information you provide during this process will remain anonymous (i.e., nobody will see your name attached to any information).

At any time in the project, you can withdraw your consent to participate. If you do this, we will no longer ask you to provide feedback on the project for the research. Contact our project facilitators if you are interested in participating. They will go through all the details about the project, research, and consent and answer any questions during the

registration process.

Goals of the Program:

- Provide safe spaces where youth can express feelings and process experiences.
- Develop healthy ways for youth to manage challenges and relationships.
- Develop coping skills to address current and future challenges.
- Promote resiliency needed for positive problem solving, life management, and decision-making.
- Enhance well-being of youth, their families, and community.
- Provide opportunities for youth to build and sustain connections and friendships.

Group Expectations:

- Participants are expected to attend all 5 sessions.
- To be open to trying new things.
- To make an effort to participate in group discussions and activities.
- To be respectful.
- To be on time for group.
- To have fun and grow.



John Bosco Wilderness Camp is a children's camp located in Narrow Hills Provincial Park, Saskatchewan. The camp offers many programs for children as well as welcome school, youth or community groups. Our staff is made of quality individuals who have a keen interest in nature and the camp. Moreover, it is a place for people to live, learn and share with each other in the natural environment that God has provided. Our wilderness setting helps campers and staff alike to develop a greater awareness and responsibility towards nature.

We offer summer programs to campers ages 8 - 17. Ages 8 to 12 enjoy canoeing, swimming, archery, orienteering, wilderness crafts, Naturelore, Discovery, and an overnight camp-out. Ages 13 to 14 spend part of the program in camp perfecting their wilderness skills and the rest of their days using those skills while participating in a hiking and canoeing trip. From the ages 14 to 16 campers are offered a variety of out tripping experiences including, hiking and canoeing. The most challenging and rewarding program we offer is our Adventure Leadership Experience where campers age 15 to 17 make the transition into leaders through a challenging 24-day experience hiking, canoeing and camping in the wilderness.

All camp programs promote responsibility to God's nature and each other. As an accredited member of the Saskatchewan Camping Association, we maintain important guidelines regarding our facilities, programs and staff. We ensure the safety of all campers and staff by providing leadership training for staff at the beginning of each session.
