Graduation Requirements

- **24 credits** (Grade 10, 11, 12 courses)
- for French Immersion students, **12 credits** must be in French
- Required credits **English**: ELA 30, HIS/IST 30, CST 30 and two more 30 level classes
- Required credits for **French Immersion**: FIM 30F, ELA 30, SSI 30F, ECA 30F and one more 30 level class
- **Also:**
 - Financial Literacy 10
 - 10, 20, or 30 level Phys. Ed.;
 - 20 level Math;
 - 20 level Science,

Competitive Programs

Engineering – early admission 90%; expected target 80%

- CHE30, PHY30, MPC30 – minimum of 70% in each course

Kinesiology – early admission 90%; expected target 80%

- BIO30, CHE30 or PHY30, MFO30 or MPC30

Kinesiology/Education – early admission 90%; expected target 82%

- BIO30, CHE30 or PHY30, MFO30 or MPC30

Education – early admission 75%; expected target 70%

- 30 level Science, 30 level Language (other than English) or Fine or Performing Art

Non-competitive Programs

Arts & Science – admission average 70%

- You will need the required classes for the program to which you are applying (ex. Physics – PHY30, MPC30)
- Biomedical Sciences – BIO30, CHE30, PHY30, MPC30 ***or*** MFO30 – minimum of 70% in each course

Agriculture & Bioresources – admission average 70%

- Course requirements depend on the program

Edwards School of Business – admission average 80%

- MFO30 ***or*** MPC30

Non-direct Entry Programs

Law – no prerequisites

- 2 yrs. preprofessional, 3 yrs. in program, 1 year articling

Nutrition/Pharmacy – BIO30, CHE30, MPC30 or MFO30

- Nutrition – 1 yr. preprofessional, 4 yrs. in program
- Pharmacy – 2 yrs. preprofessional, 4 yrs. in program

Nursing – BIO30, MPC30 or MFO30 (CHE30 recommended)

- 1 yr. preprofessional, 3 yrs. in program

Dentistry/Vet Med/Medicine – BIO30, CHE30, PHY30, MPC30 or MFO30

- Dentistry – 3 yrs. preprofessional, 4 yrs. in program
- Vet Med – 2 yrs. preprofessional, 4 yrs. in program
- Medicine – 4 yr. bachelor's degree, 4 yrs. in program, 2 yrs. post-grad

- FQFA (First Qualified First Admitted)
 - Applications open September 1 each year
- Saskatchewan Collaborative Bachelor of Science in Nursing
 - ✓ offered jointly by the Saskatchewan Polytechnic and the University of Regina
 - ✓ competitive program; direct entry
 - ✓ BIO30, CHE30, MFO30 or MPC30 (min. 70% average, including ELA30, ELB30)

- High Demand (competitive) * List may change each year
 - ✓ Combined Laboratory and X-Ray Technology
 - ✓ Dental Hygiene

 - ✓ Psychiatric Nursing

Process for Applying

In general, the process for applying to a post-secondary program is the following:

- Fill out application form (almost always online) and pay application fee
 - ✓ Make sure all necessary parts of application are completed
- Request your Official Ministry transcript be shared with the institution
 - ✓ You need to create a My Creds account; this is the place from which you share your Official transcript
- Sheets are available in Student Services to help with applying and with setting up your My Creds account

MyCreds.ca



- **First** fill out the Request for High School and Adult 12 Transcripts form at the following **Government** link: **[Request your High School Transcripts](#)**
- The information provided will be used to search for your transcript record.
- You will receive an email from MyCreds indicating there is a document (transcript) available. Please follow the link in that email to register your account with MyCreds.
- Once you have registered your account you will need to buy a “share credit” to view and/or share your transcript.



When Sharing Your Transcript

- Share to the organization, not to an email
- Do not set an expiry date (it may cause applicants to have to reorder/reshare transcripts)
- Student numbers (ex. NSID) is NOT a required field – you do not have to fill this out
- Multiple shares are not required (as long as you do not set an expiry date); MyCreds will continue to update when new grades are received

 - **Do not wait for Exit Plan meeting to apply to post-secondary**
