A friendly reminder of some rink rules:

- Have fun and be respectful. ❤️
- No sticks during family/public skating times or learn to skate programs. Respect the rink skating schedule as posted. 🏒
- Spend a few minutes scraping the ice. 🗑️
- Shovel snow OVER the boards. When shovelled snow is left against the boards, it turns to solid ice and the volunteer crew is getting too old to shovel hard now. 🧑‍🌾
- Always leave the place cleaner than you found it. Don't leave garbage and if you see some, please pick it up. There are garbage cans outside and inside the warm-up rink. 🗑️
- Children and inexperienced skaters should use an approved helmet while on the ice to prevent injuries. 🧢🧢🧢
- Do not use the rink during unusually warm weather. ☀️
- Stay off the ice surface while it's being resurfaced. 🧑‍🌾
