Conexus Credit Union is now accepting applications for our Youth Leadership Awards for the 2025/2026 academic school year! This year, we'll be awarding **12 scholarships of \$5,000 each** to graduating high school students who are making a difference in their communities through leadership and volunteer efforts. **Note:** On January 1st, Conexus Credit Union merged with Cornerstone Credit Union and Synergy Credit Union and are currently building the new Conexus Credit Union. Members of any of the three institutions are welcome to apply.

In order to be eligible:

- Students or their parent/legal guardian must be a member of Conexus Credit Union, Cornerstone Credit Union, or Synergy Credit Union for a minimum of one year and with accounts in good standing.
- Students must be graduating from high school in the current academic school year.
- Students must complete all sections of the application form, including all required supporting documents by May 15.

Applications close at 4:30 pm CST on Friday May 15, 2026. For more information and to apply, go to conexus.ca/YLA.

The Saskatchewan Association of School Business Officials (SASBO) scholarship: SASBO is a professional association whose members support kindergarten to Grade 12 education through a number of business and support roles including finance/accounting, human resources and payroll, facilities (buildings and grounds maintenance), transportation management, procurement, technology, and communications. The purpose of the scholarship is to support the students that association members serve, and raise awareness of the career opportunities within Saskatchewan's education sector for business- or management-minded individuals. There will be a maximum of two \$1,500 scholarships awarded annually.

Eligibility

- The scholarship is open to Saskatchewan residents only. This includes students who reside in neighboring provinces but attend a Saskatchewan school division. Students attending on a tuition basis are not eligible. For the purposes of this scholarship, "tuition students" refers to individuals who attend a Saskatchewan school division on a fee-paying basis and who are not provincially funded or resident students within the division.
- Applicants shall be a graduating student, or a student who has graduated in the last five years, from a provincial school division or First Nations school in Saskatchewan, entering the first year of an eligible program.
- Applicants must be entering a program of study at an accredited university or college in Saskatchewan that would prepare the applicant to work in one of the roles listed above. A SASBO related field of study includes post-secondary programs that prepare students for roles in the operational, financial, administrative or technical functions of school divisions. Eligible fields may include business, accounting, finance, human resources, information technology, facilities management, skilled trades, and other disciplines that support k-12 education systems.
- The program shall be a minimum of a two-year program (can include internships, practicums or work terms that are part of the program).

School of Creative Media, Saskatchewan Polytechnic: Hello, my name is Dr. Adam Pottle. I'm the Arts & Sciences Coordinator for the North region, and I'm writing to tell you all about a workshop I'm leading in May. The workshop is called "Blueprint for a Story." It is a two-day affair taking place in Room 312 at the Saskatoon Idylwyld campus on Saturday, May 23rd and Saturday, May 30th from 1 to 4 pm. It is free of charge and open to anyone interested in writing for film and television. This workshop introduces attendees to the different elements of scriptwriting, including formats, structure, dialogue, and characterization. For those interested in pursuing screenwriting more seriously, we will also touch on how to navigate the business. The goal of this workshop is to produce a short script. After the second day, attendees will submit their short scripts to the instructor for feedback. (There's no limit on genre and there's no grading, so everyone can relax.) A little about me: in addition to serving as A&S Coordinator in Saskatoon, I'm also a writer with seven published books and two produced plays. I've served as writer-in-residence at Sheridan College and was a 2022 Warner Bros. Discovery Access screenwriting fellow. I currently serve on the writing staff of a television show (sorry, I can't say which one yet). I've led creative writing classes and workshops for colleges, libraries, and other institutions. Storytelling is a coveted skill in virtually all environments: at home, in the workplace, at the gym. Being able to craft a cohesive narrative builds confidence, creativity, and empathy and helps when networking with other people. It also comes in handy when giving presentations, leading meetings, and filling out incident reports, and screenwriting, with its emphasis on action and character, is one of the purest forms of storytelling there is. Anyone who's wanted to learn more about screenwriting (or just wanted to kickstart their imaginations) is welcome to attend. Registration is capped at 25, so be sure to register soon.
