Canadian Coast Guard Academy: The Academy is a national, bilingual, degree-conferring training institution located in Sydney, Nova Scotia. We are a unique marine academy with the purpose of saving lives, protecting the environment, and contributing to Canada's economic growth. The Academy offers young Canadians the opportunity to pursue an adventurous career as a marine engineering officer or navigation officer in the Canadian Coast Guard. This is a four-year education training program in either discipline, including theoretical courses, simulator training, and practical training, both at the Academy and on Coast Guard ships. When students begin the program, they become employees of the Government of Canada. As employees enrolled in the education training program, students join a community where they have the opportunity to meet new people, discover rare parts of Canada, and participate in opportunities aimed at helping them develop as leaders.

Did you know that at the Canadian Coast Guard Academy:

- Our graduates earn a bachelor's degree.
- Our students have no debt upon graduation.
- Our graduates are guaranteed a job at the end of their studies.
- Our students must have knowledge of physics and advanced math (and chemistry if they are interested in marine engineering).

- The application period is now open until February 13, 2026.
