**BJM Scholarship Application:** Hi all Grade 12 students. The link to the BJM Scholarship Application has been sent to you through Edsby messages; you must log on to your GSCS Portal first, then check your Edsby messages. (If you receive a DO NOT HAVE ACCESS message, login to Google with your school email). Applications open up on Monday, March 23 and **close on Thursday, April 2**. Please take time to look through the information carefully to make sure you meet the criteria before applying. Even if you are not applying for the scholarships, take a look at the Saint Shields category; this is for participating in school activities from grades 9 - 12. **The National Youth Climate Activism Award** is a registered Canadian non-profit that has been working in the climate sphere for 19 years.
