Canadian Forces Family Scholarship from The Bridge City SaskTel Pioneers: The SaskTel Pioneers is a network of volunteers who effect immediate, tangible change in local communities. One of the pillars of support that the Pioneers provide is to the Canadian Armed Forces. As such, we want to provide this scholarship to support a child or dependant of a current or former member of the Canadian Armed Forces who is graduating from grade 12 this school year. Priority will be given to students who will be going on to post secondary education, but applicants who are not pursuing post secondary education will also be considered. The value of the award is \$1000. To be considered for this scholarship:

- Must be a Grade 12 student in good academic standing
- Must be a child or dependent of a current or former serving member of the Canadian Armed Forces (CAF); student must provide proof of parent or guardian's service in the CAF such as a copy of a Military Service Identification Card, a Veteran's Service Card, or a Certificate of Service.
- Provide a 250-word description of how they are active in their school and community, highlighting volunteerism and good character.

Application information is in Student Services; completed applications are to be turned into Student Services by **Friday, May 15**. Completed applications will be sent on to the GSCS Foundation office where a committee will make the recipient selection.

- **Pre-Registration:** It is mandatory to pre-register for a course registration session. This will ensure a smooth and efficient process for all participants.
- **Session Selection:** Students must register for CRD through **their application portal**. Students will scroll near the bottom of their portal to 'Course Registration Days.' They will be able to see a list of the available sessions and dates. Once they select one, they can review their information and click 'Register.'
- **Limited Space:** Due to space constraints, we kindly request all students to sign up for the event in advance to secure a spot in the advising session.
- **Zoom Links:** Zoom links for the event will be provided in the confirmation email upon registration.
