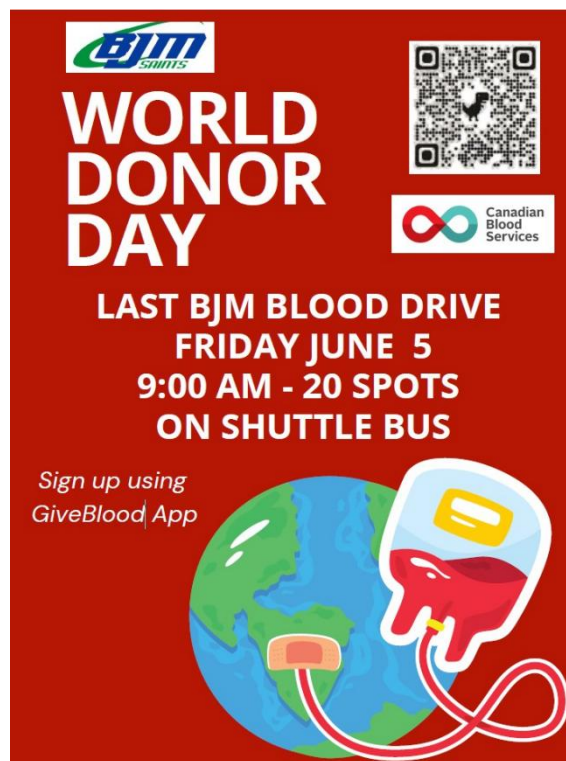

- Pre-Registration: It is mandatory to pre-register for a course registration session. This will ensure a smooth and efficient process for all participants.
- Session Selection: Students must register for CRD through their application portal. Students will scroll near the bottom of their portal to 'Course Registration Days.' They will be able to see the available session and date. Once they select it, they can review their information and click 'Register.'
- Limited Space: Due to space constraints, we kindly request all students to sign up for the event in advance to secure a spot in the advising session.
- Zoom Links: Zoom links for the event will be provided in the confirmation email upon registration.
- Students will still be able to register for courses if they do not attend a CRD event, but they will need to reach out to their faculty advisors on their own for assistance.

Horatio Alger Vocational & Technical Education Scholarship: Award Amount: 25 scholarships at \$3,000 each. The Vocational & Technical Education Scholarships are awarded to eligible students across all provinces and territories in Canada.

Eligibility Requirements

- Have completed high school (or earned high school equivalency credential) by July 1
- Enrolled in hands-on vocational, technical, or trades training for Fall 2026 at a public or not-for-profit institution
- Demonstrated critical financial need (applicants must show household annual net income of \$80,000 or less)
- Be under the age of 35
- Be a Canadian citizen or permanent resident living in Canada
