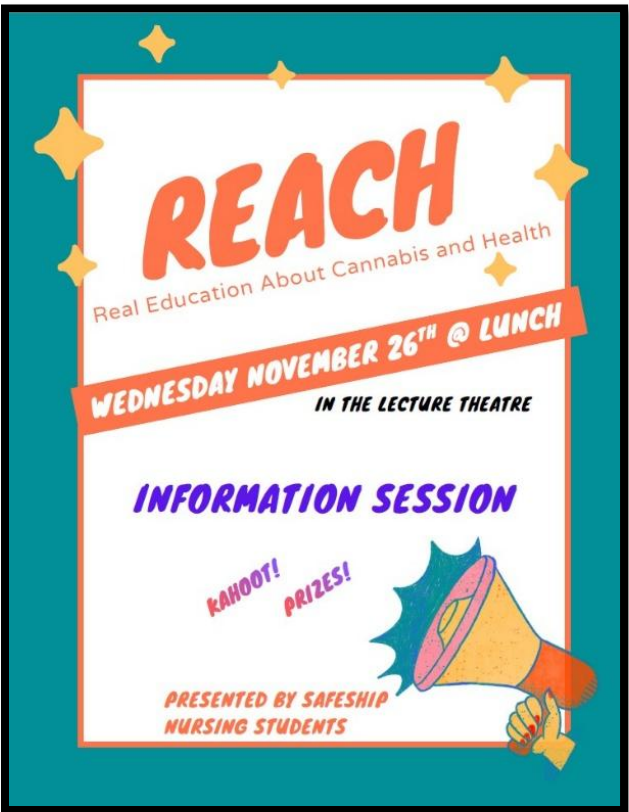

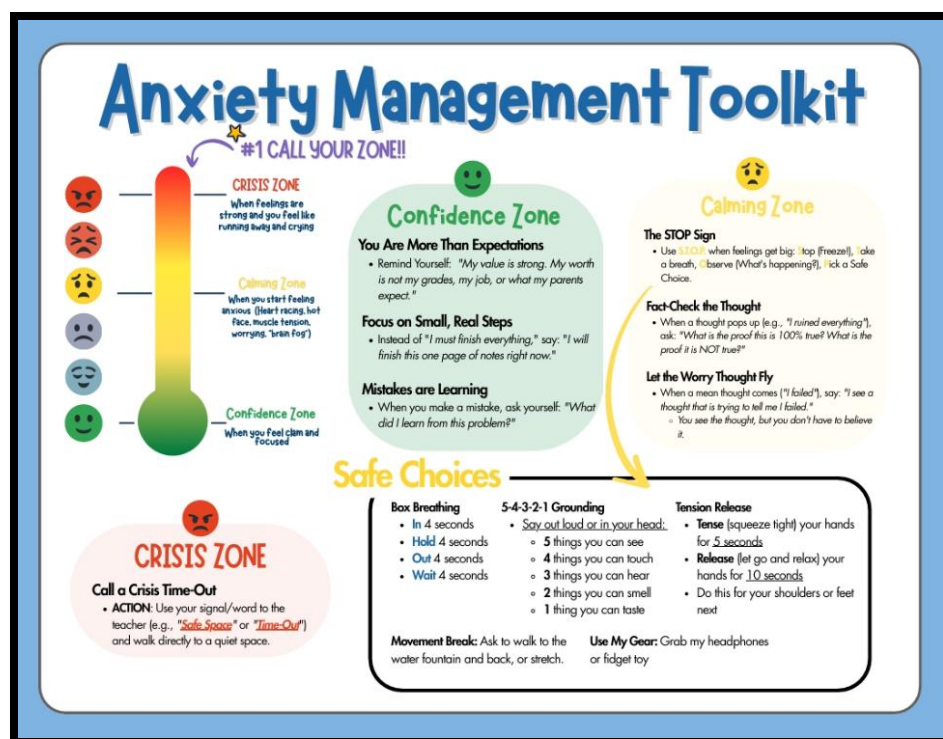

This popular event gives students the opportunity to:

- Save \$50 on their application fee
- Get personalized help from our Enrolment Services team!
- Receive an admission decision on the spot (for eligible applicants)

What students should bring:

- Current high school students: school-certified/unofficial transcript

Important note:

- International students are not eligible for Admission on the Spot or the reduced application fee.
- Music Education, Indigenous Education, and le Baccalauréat en éducation applicants will receive the discount but won't be admitted on the spot at the event.
- Nursing applicants must apply through Saskatchewan Polytechnic but can still get the discounted fee by applying to another program.

This is a great opportunity for your students to apply, get admitted, and start their U of R journey — all in one evening!

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Firefighter Introduction Recruitment Experience (F.I.R.E.) Cadet Program: For Grade 11 and Grade 12 students. The F.I.R.E. Cadets program gives high school students the opportunity to learn about what it takes to be a firefighter through building new and strengthening existing life skills. These skills are intended to contribute to one's success in all aspects of life, including future career applications. Participants are coached in responsibility, respect, leadership, community involvement, teamwork, pride, and professionalism.

Details:

- The course is 8 weeks long, running from Monday, April 20, 2026, to Thursday, June 11, 2026
- Mondays - Thursdays
- 2:30pm to 4:30pm
- In order for this to work, you must have a spare in Semester 2, Period 5. If you do not have a spare Ms. Sacher or Mrs. Jarrett Lund can help with adjusting your Semester 2 schedule.
- Students may choose to earn a credit as well, Career & Work Exploration A30 (CWA30). If this option is chosen, there would be academic work to do along with the practical experience.
- There is a comprehensive application to fill out, including getting references.
