2. Meetings were held monthly this year, with the exception of December, which was missed due to the Christmas break. Meetings in January and February were held online due to increased covid numbers in those months.

3. We hosted our trustee at our November meeting as well as the GSCS FNMI consultant at the April meeting.

What was accomplished this year?

1. Several fundraisers were held this year. We held a clothing sale (\$1160), Cowboy Caviar sale (\$1559), Virtual Family Bingo Night (\$2072) and Easter Basket Raffle (\$2110). A school supply drive was held to help assist Ukrainian refugee families arriving in Saskatoon.

2. Funds raised throughout the year were used to purchase a class set of iPads and an additional three iPads and three Chromebooks for the students. We also donated \$500 to each Kids Haven House and Ukrainian refugee families as part of Holy Week at the school.

3. Staff appreciation was given by hosting a staff lunch during Staff Appreciation Week and a gift card bouquet at year end.

4. Healthy Hunger lunches returned and were held with great success, a total of \$4300 was raised and put into the student's classrooms for use for additional learning experiences.

Learning Goals

1. The CSCC helped support the school learning goals this year by learning more about Treaty Education and Truth and Reconciliation. Special CSCC meetings and discussion were held on both of these topics. Our Grade 4-6 students were able to attend the Batoche field trip that was missed the last two years due to covid restrictions. A CSCC member attended the kindergarten open house in order to introduce new families to council., new kindergarten families were

invited to attend our AGM.

Nominations

1. This is my second year as chair, therefore we will accept any nominations for chair. I will let my name stand for another term.
2. Melanie will continue on as secretary for another year to complete her term.

Moving forward to 2022-2023

1. Looking ahead to next school year, I would like to hold an in-person family event at the school to help build relationships between school and home.
2. We will continue to fundraise as needed for the school. This will be more important then ever with government budget cuts effecting schools at the classroom level.

Thank you! We would like to thank the CSCC for their generous support this past year. They helped us purchase pads/Chromebooks and provided a lovely lunch and treats for the staff throughout the year. We are so grateful to have such a dynamic, active and dedicated parent council at Saint Luke School!

In our Learning Improvement Plan, the school focused on three learning goals:

1. 80% of our Gr 3-8 students will be at grade level in Reading according to Benchmark Assessments by June 2022. Our students are very strong in reading. In March, we had already surpassed our goal.
2. By June 2022: All students would learn about Treaty Education, with projects culminating in our Treaty Medal Celebration. The Treaty Medal celebration was amazing - thank you to the many families who came out to show their support!
3. Anti-Racist, Anti-Oppressive Education - Staff worked all year with our Anti-Racism board office committee, learning about their own biases and privileges. We received a grant from the Multicultural Society of Saskatchewan to help pay for picture books as resources to support Tackling Issues of Racism in the Elementary Classroom. Students Gr 5-8 also participated in a session called Roots of Hate and Intolerance, put on by the Friends of Simon Weisenthal Centre for Holocaust Studies based out of Toronto.

Staffing - We have three retirements - Mrs. Oberg, Mrs. Mitchell, and Mrs. Clarke. Mrs. Gandzalas, Mrs. Rasmussen, Ms. Draegar and Mrs. Govpak-Gyp will be moving to other schools next fall! We wish them all the best. We would like to welcome Mr. Blair Weinheimer, Mme. Kathryn McPherson-Chambers and Mlle. Dana Ronellenfitsch"who will be coming to our school in the fall. We still have some staffing to work through, including replacing teachers who will still be on maternity leave in the fall. We also have some temporary teachers whose contracts end with this school year Mr. Ferwerda, Mr. Holcomb, Ms. Kerpan and Mlle. Kirkpatrick, Mme. Gauthier and Mrs. Duda. We were also blessed to have Mrs. Kimpton and Ms. Letkeman on staff as EAs for part of the year. They were wonderful additions to our school!

Next year's budget - even though our school has grown in size, we lost a teacher. As a result, you will notice larger class sizes and fewer supports for your children. Since 2014, funding per student has gone from \$15,000 to \$10,000 despite inflation, etc.

COVID19 protocols - A huge thank you to the community for their amazing support this year as we navigated a very challenging year. It was truly a team effort in keeping students and staff safe.
