

How To Apply:

Please read the following carefully

- This document includes important reminders and criteria for each of the awards.
- LOG ON to your Portal (this is the only way to access the app!) and go to the EDF website under Student Services.
- Read the scholarship criteria on Page Two and Three of this document.
- Upload the following:
 - \circ 1) Copy of Acceptance Letter to Post-Secondary Program, and
 - \circ 2) Any documents necessary for scholarships which require additional information.
- If you have applied and paid your application fee <u>BUT</u> have yet to be accepted into a program, you are still eligible to apply SEE A COUNSELLOR for more info!
- Once you are ready to apply, select the Grade 12 Scholarship Application

A. Yearly Scholarships

Les and Irene Dubé Service & Justice Scholarship Number: 1 Value: \$2,000.00 Criteria: 1. Attendance at E.D. Feehan for entire Grade 12 year. 2. The student must be a graduating grade 12 student and eligible for admission to the University of Saskatchewan in the College of Arts & Science and St. Thomas More College. The student must show strong academic promise (85% or better average in the following courses: Catholic Studies 20 or 30, English A30 or B30, 3. and three 30 level electives; PE30 and PAA30 not accepted) To receive the award: The student must enroll as a full time (registered in at least 9 credit units per term) self-declared St. Thomas More College Student at the University of Saskatchewan in the College Arts & Science. The student must register in a minimum of 6 credit units of courses taught by St. Thomas More College. Students must meet with an academic advisor at St. Thomas More College before registering to ensure the academic requirements have been fulfilled. The student will be required to participate in the Service & Justice Project that is coordinated by Engaged Learning Office. Gabruch Family Trojan Award Number: 2 (One female/one male) Value: \$250.00 each Criteria: 1. The students are individuals who do not seek recognition, but whose efforts are so remarkable that they deserve recognition and more, as chosen by the staff. 2. Recipients do not need to be going on to post-secondary. E.D. Feehan "Who I am Makes a Difference" Award Value: \$250.00 Number: 1 Criteria: 1. Awarded to a Grade 12 graduate of E.D. Feehan High School who has demonstrated immeasurable character, overcome adversity and has made great strides towards their growth as a student and an individual. NOTE: There is not an application for this award - nominations from staff members and selection by staff scholarship committee. Grads of 1999 Scholarship Value: \$200.00 Number: 1 Criteria: 1. Grade 12 student. 2. The scholarship will be awarded to a student that is a 'good well-rounded individual'; one that possesses and exhibits the qualities of a good school citizen; one that normally does not receive public notice in the school. 3. It is not designed for a top academic student but for one that has attained University/Sask Polytech entrance requirements. Grads of 1996 Scholarship Number: 1 Value: \$200.00 Criteria: 1. The scholarship will be awarded to a student that is working at his/her potential; one that possesses and exhibits the qualities of a good, school citizen and that normally does not receive public notice in the school. 2. It is designed for a student that is not on the honour roll but has attained the entrance requirements for the post-secondary program of their choice. B. Scholarships which require additional information E.D. Feehan Alumni Scholarship Number: 1 Value: \$1,000.00 Criteria: 1. Attendance at E.D. Feehan for entire Grade 12 year. 2. Must be entering first year of post-secondary studies ie: U of S, Sask Polytechnic, etc. in Saskatchewan. 3. Academic average which meets entrance requirements for chosen post-secondary institution. 4. Demonstrates good character and Christian values. Is a positive influence on those around him/her.

5. Financial need will be considered.

To apply, complete one document with the following information and upload this with the E.D. Feehan Alumni section of the application.

Submit a *brief statement* describing career goals and planned program for post-secondary studies; briefly describe how you are planning to fund vour education.

- Submit a *personal profile* that summarizes most significant high school experiences (a reflection of events and activities rather than a listing).
- Submit a copy of acceptance letter into your program of choice (if you haven't done so already).

Desirée Community Builder Scholarship

- 1. Awarded to a graduating student with an academic success level commensurate with the student's abilities.
- 2. Demonstrated volunteer service and community involvement.
- 3. Preference given to students who are the first generation in their family to seek post-secondary education.
- 4. Preference will be given to Indigenous students and those from refugee families.

5. Scholarship will be paid to a recognized post-secondary institution to cover recipient's tuition within three years after being awarded. To apply, applicants must complete an accompanying 250-500 word essay demonstrating their passion for serving and strengthening their communities. The essay should answer the following questions:

- 1. What is my biggest dream to make my community stronger and more just?
- 2. What needs to change in my community?
- 3. How can I be part of this change?
- Please also include in your essay:
 - Your post-secondary goals and choice of major, what you intend to do with your education, and why a scholarship is important to you.
 - Any academic or non-academic accomplishments, personal characteristics, or experiences that make you uniquely worthy of scholarship consideration.

C. Scholarships offered across GSCS

Canadian Forces Family Scholarship (from the Bridge City Sasktel Pioneers) Number: 1

Criteria:

- 1. Must be a Grade 12 student in good academic standing.
- Must be a child or dependent of a current or former serving member of the Canadian Armed Forces (CAF). Student must provide proof of parent or guardian's service in the CAF such as a copy of a Military Service Identification Card, a Veteran's Service Card, or a Certificate of Service.
- 3. Must demonstrate good character and involvement or support in the school or community as recognized or recommended by GSCS teachers and staff.
- To be considered for this scholarship, a student must submit their application by way of the attached QR code by May 15th and:
 - Provide copies of the proof of their parent/guardian's current or former service with the CAF as outlined above.
 - Provide a 250-word description of how they are active in their school and community, highlighting volunteerism and good character.

All applications will be submitted to the GSCS Foundation office, at which time a committee will select a recipient.

Iris and Zach Hauser Art Award

- 1. Awarded to one Gr. 12 student in GSCS who will be a full-time student attending an art program in a recognized post-secondary learning institution.
- 2. The recipient is a student graduating from one of the GSCS high schools who has demonstrated talent and dedication in the field of arts. This student's art portfolio and resume demonstrates a strong commitment to developing an artistic practice. The recipient must be planning to pursue studies in art-related fields.
- 3. The award may be held over for one year upon written notice to the Foundation Director.
- 4. **Deadline April 30th** see the Art teacher or school counsellor to apply.

Kim Sawchuk Memorial Scholarship

Criteria:

- 1. Attendance during their tenure at both Bishop Klein and their current High School.
- 2. An academic success level commensurate with one's abilities.
- 3. Involvement in school programs i.e. athletics, choir, drama, SRC, etc.
- 4. Demonstrated leadership in living up to school expectation as outlined in the school's belief statements.
- 5. Demonstrated a positive school spirit.
- 6. Financial need may be a consideration.
- 7. Student must apply for scholarship.

Tenability

The scholarship is intended for former Bishop Klein students who are currently in Grade 12 in a Catholic High School and will be attending a postsecondary institution.

Application Process

Students are to prepare a *written statement* which attests to how they perceive themselves regarding the above criteria. This submission is to be presented to the principal of Bishop Klein School by June 6th, 2025. Applications can be emailed directly to Burton Harper at <u>bharper@gscs.ca</u>.

Claiming Procedure:

In September, the recipients are required to forward a confirmation of enrollment from their post-secondary institution to:
