Who Should Register?

 All current Grade 10 & 11 students who know they are returning to Holy Cross next year

 If you are unsure if you are returning, still complete the selection online.

 If you are not returning to Holy Cross, please report to Ms. Regier or Mr. Revering at the office by the end of March.

Purpose of Online Registration:

- To determine the number of students that want to take a particular course.
- To determine the number of class sections for each course offering.
- To determine staffing needs.

Caution

 Be as accurate as possible when making your selections since the planning of next year's course offerings are based on your selections.

 Very few changes will be made once courses have been selected.

Caution

- You are responsible to ensure that you have the required prerequisite course for any class that you select online.
- Please refer to the online registration handbook for course descriptions and their prerequisites. This can be found on the Holy Cross website under the 'Registration' tab.

Terms To Know:

- Prerequisite courses
- Required courses and Elective courses
- EAL (English as an Additional Language) and LAS (Learning Assistance) courses
- Advanced & AP (Advanced Placement) courses

Term 1: Prerequisites

- Class that is needed before you can proceed to a higher level.
- Ex: ELA10 and ELB10 are prerequisites for ELA20
- Ex: MFP10 is a prerequisite for MFO20

The SK Ministry of Education withholds credits earned without a prerequisite.

Term 2: Required & Elective Courses

- Required courses are mandated by the SK Ministry of Education – all students must take them.
- Elective courses are courses that are not required and are selected by each individual student based on what is offered.

Both required and elective courses count toward the 24 credits needed to graduate.

Term 3: EAL and LAS

- EAL is English as an Additional Language.
- ELA is English Language Arts.
- EAL is NOT ELA
- EAA10L, EAB10L, EAA20L, EAB20L and EAC20L
 are credit courses offered for EAL students.
- LAS are Learning Assistance Classes sign up for LAS if you require learning supports.
- EAL and LAS tutorials are non-credit classes.

Term 4: Advanced Classes & Advanced Placement (AP)

- Some Advanced Programs at Holy Cross start in Grade 10 - Art, Math & English Language Arts – and lead to Advanced Placement (AP) classes in grade 12 wherein students can achieve university credits.
- AP Classes in grade 12 are in the areas of Art,
 Math, English Language Arts, French, Music and Chemistry.

- Students interested in AP programming must visit the Holy Cross webpage & click on 'Registration' to do the following:
 - A) Read the 'AP Informational PPT'
 - B) Complete the online Advanced Programming Application form
 - C) Register online for the advanced program through the portal
 - D) Once registration closes, an email will be sent to applicants re: the status of their application.

We recommend no more than two AP programs.




Math Pathways After Grade 9



Math Information for Gr. 11

- Grade 10 Students: If you have already taken MFP10 and you require extra Math support, consider taking Math Foundations 20 Yearlong (MF020Y). This class offers MFO20 over two semesters.
- Consult with your current math teacher or your LAS Teacher
- MFO20Y counts as 2 class selections in your registration process (two spots in timetable).

Special Class Information

BAND

- BAN20N should register for ELA20 and CST20 as normal. One of these courses will alternate with your band class. You cannot pick which. Students who take Band, French Immersion and AP English will need one-semester band. This will be adjusted for you.
- BAN30N select CST30N.
- 30-level French Immersion students may need to take one-semester band.

BAND cont...

 Those in Ms. McGonigal's sections should take BAB20N or BAB30N – Brass.

 Those in Ms. Reynold's sections should take BAW20N or BAW30N – Woodwinds.

CHOIR 20 & 30

- This year you will register for Choir by signing up on a list in Student Services at the main office.
- Choir will not be registered online. Choir will be added to your selections once you have signed up at Student Services.
- Choir takes place over lunch hours.

ELECTIVES

- There are many electives available to students at the 10 to 30 level to fulfill the 24-credit unit graduation requirement.
- Students may take electives at a higher grade level if they have the necessary pre-requisites (as stated in the registration booklet).


