- David asked if the school knows anything about the results from the national standardized testing. Darren explained that the CAT test tells us about individual student results, but less about the overall school results. Still waiting for direction on the Our School survey. Uncertain whether this will move ahead this year.
- David asks how many schools Fr. Gerard is involved with. There are many!
- 6. Trustee visit
- Welcome to Hudson.
- Not necessarily a report and cannot speak on behalf of the board.
- The board is working hard to address the large class sizes.
- The challenges with the teacher contract negotiations weighs heavily on the board.

Questions:

- David asks about the structure of the board and the role of the trustee. The board has
 involvement with governance and policy outside of the day-to-day operations. They
 would make decisions such as busing contracts. How often do they meet? Roughly every
 2 weeks. How do they govern education and what influence do they have on education?
 The board hires Francois Rivard, the Director of Education. An analogy in a bakery would
 be that the board brings in the supplies, but the school administration is responsible for
 all of the operations in the bakery.
- Hudson has an open-door policy and welcomes any ideas or questions. Because the trustee is an elected position, they serve the people.
- There is a lot of attention on class size and complexity. Are you hearing this from parents? Yes, to an extent. Darren also expressed that he hears about concerns from parents.
- David asks if the board has influence on how the division operates their budget and how they allocate resources. Yes, to a degree they do.

- Historically the board could adjust the mill rate, and the budget was allocated directly based on the mill rate. This is no longer the case, and the money from the mill rate goes to the ministry and is distributed accordingly. Currently the struggle for the board is choosing the least bad option.
- David wants to highlight his concern with class sizes. For example, 30 kids in one classroom in elementary. His other concern is the split classes in the English stream given the small numbers at Mother Teresa. Classroom discipline is another concern. There are no more programs for gifted students (ELO was cut last year). David would also like to have the ability for parents and students to provide feedback to the board on teachers and/or school.

7. Liaison Reports

- a. Community Association:
 - Welcome to Adam (President) and Taylor (Youth Coordinator). Only came to Adam's attention recently that the CSCC would like a report from the SCA. Adam has been on the SCA for about 7 years.
 - Currently sharing programming with several other community associations, with very low participation from Silverspring families. This means that the SCA does not bring in any money from their programming. They are currently looking for ideas from the community to find activities that families are interested in. Pickle ball has been extremely popular and has been their largest revenue generator. But they would like to find other activities that bring value to the community.
 - A few events coming up include the park clean-up on Earth Day (Apr 22). Since the school is cleaning up during the day, the SCA can focus on other areas of the neighbourhood in the evening (likely 6:30 meet at Ebenezer Church). Will be advertised through Edbsy and on the website/Facebook page. Also planning the garage sale day on June 15, and partnering with other neighbourhoods in the northeast. Planning to host a BBQ and allow kids to advertise the sales they are having (e.g., lemonade stands). There is a nature columnist living in the neighbourhood, and they are offering walks and tours of the swale.
 - The SCA also connected to an Indigenous person that offer beading classes and could potentially offer an event for Indigenous Peoples Day. We do not have a soccer coordinator in the community.
 - Looking to partner with the community, including the schools and churches. Also looking for any talents in the community that somebody is willing to offer.
 - The Facebook page is also no longer a forum, but an information/educational space. The SCA will plan to stay in touch and send reports to the CSCC with some consistency.
- **b. Preschool:** No representative in attendance.

c. St. Joseph's Highschool: St. Joseph's is growing again. Anticipating an additional 100 students and 4 portables in the fall, with the total number of students being around 1450. The new high school in Holmwood is not expected to be available until 2027. There have been consequences to this including the lack of gym time, such that grade 11 physical education can no longer be offered. Also due to changes in the curriculum, there is no longer the option of offering industrial arts and some other practical skills to grade 9 students, due to the lack of space. The focus will remain on the upper year students.
