## CSCC Meeting- May. 27th, 2024- Principal's Report

1. School Start (Name of a company)

- We are ready to go for this in Fall. Information will be sent home to parents in the near future. School supplies will be sent directly to your home in August. Parents have the option to select and de-select items on the list of school supplies.

2. Pastoral Care

- Strategic Plan Goals
- Goal 1: Strengthen our understanding and support of students who identify or who have family members who identify as gender and/or sexually diverse.
- Goal 2: Foster meaningful connections with students, staff, families, and the wider community to support our growth as inclusive, safe, and caring Catholic communities.
- Goal 3: Support school leadership by developing and enhancing administrative procedures related to human sexuality and family life, and equity and inclusion.
- Goal 4: Develop a positive and comprehensive communication plan to support schools throughout the year.
- Goal 5: Develop age-appropriate prayer and faith resources for both elementary and high schools to emphasize love and respect Safe Spaces Poster:
- It is the product of an extensive consultation process involving students in our high school YAC (Youth Alliance Circle) groups, parents, elders, the bishop and the bishop's delegate, and other community members. The ones who probably had the biggest voice and that were listened to the most were the high school students.
- The top of the poster shows some of the diversity in our schools, including students who identify as gender or sexually diverse. This is represented by the different colors of hands and wrist bands representing different groups.
- The hands are all reaching out to a stylized sacred heart of Jesus. June is recognized by the church all over the world, in all its diversity, as the month of the sacred heart. It's a symbol of Christ's sacrificial and unending love for all of his people.
- The words "We Are All Welcome Here" were chosen by students in our YAC groups.
- (Fr. Matthew spoke at the CSCC liaison meeting) Why this matters? Increasing numbers of gender diverse students; Unique challenges faced by gender diverse students; Catholicism seen as obstacle rather than support

- There is a decent chance the English stream will be adding one additional classroom next year, if the growth continues the way it has. Unfortunately, this likely would happen with a shuffle in mid-September. The numbers in French immersion are roughly where expected for this time of the year.
- Anticipating will be up about 15 students in English, and down about 20 students in French. Currently we're at 525 students, which is about right for the size of the school.
