PURPOSE

- To provide information for 2026-27 course selection
- To communicate information regarding Gr. 10, Gr. 11 and Gr. 12 required courses
- To highlight frequently asked questions

Who Should Register?

- All current Grade 9 – 11 students who know they are returning to Holy Cross next year
- If you are unsure if you are returning, still complete the selection online.
- If you are not returning to Holy Cross, please report to Ms. Regier (A-H), Ms. Bartake (I-M) or Mr. Steckler (N-Z) at the office by the end of March.

Purpose of Online Registration:

- To determine the number of students that want to take a particular course.
- To determine the number of class sections for each course offering.
- To determine staffing needs.

Caution

- Be as accurate as possible when making your selections since the planning of next year's course offerings are based on your selections.
- Very few changes will be made once courses have been selected.

Caution

- You are responsible to ensure that you have the required prerequisite course for any class that you select online.
- Please refer to the online registration handbook for course descriptions and prerequisites. This can be found on the Holy Cross website under the 'Registration' tab.

Terms To Know:

- Prerequisite courses
- Required courses and Elective courses
- EAL (English as an Additional Language) and LAS (Learning Assistance) courses
- Advanced & AP (Advanced Placement) courses

Term 1 : Prerequisites

- Class that is needed before you can proceed to a higher level.
- Ex: SCI10 is a prerequisite for HSC 20
- Ex: MFP10 is a prerequisite for MFO20

The SK Ministry of Education withholds credits earned without a prerequisite.

Term 2: Required & Elective Courses

- **Required courses** are mandated by the SK Ministry of Education – all students must take them.
- **Elective courses** are courses that are not required and are selected by each individual student based on what is offered.

Both required and elective courses count toward the 24 credits needed to graduate.

Term 3: EAL and LAS

- EAL is English as an Additional Language.
- ELA is English Language Arts.
- ***EAL is NOT ELA***
- EAA10L, EAB10L, EAA20L, EAB20L and EAC20L – are credit courses offered for EAL students.
- LAS are Learning Assistance Classes – sign up for LAS if you require learning supports.
- **EAL and LAS tutorials are non-credit classes.**

Term 4: Advanced Classes & Advanced Placement (AP)

- Some Advanced Programs at Holy Cross start in Grade 10 - Art & English Language Arts – and lead to Advanced Placement (AP) classes in grade 12 wherein students can achieve university credits.
- AP Classes in grade 12 are in the areas of Art, Biology, Chemistry, English Language Arts, French, and Calculus.

Advanced Classes & Advanced Placement (AP)

What's New?

- AP Classes in the subject areas of Biology, Calculus, Chemistry, and English Language Arts will change to **FULL YEAR** classes that will follow a DAY A/DAY B format. Students will obtain two credits in June including an advanced placement 'P' designation.
- Please note that AP Art and AP French will remain unchanged.
- Students accepted into AP programs for the 2026-2027 school year will be expected to register, pay for and commit to the AP exam by end of October 2026 and complete the AP exam in Spring 2027.
- Students enrolled in AP programs next year who wish to drop must do so prior to Semester 2 to allow them the option of enrolling in a Semester 2 regular credit.

- Students interested in AP programming must visit the Holy Cross webpage & click on 'Registration' to do the following:


A) *Read the 'AP Informational PowerPoint'*

You must have a minimum of 12 credits in French Immersion to qualify for a Bilingual Diploma.

There is room for 30 credits plus 3 choral credits (taken at noon).

A minimum of 24 credits are required to graduate.

Math Information for Gr. 10

- Math Foundations and Precalculus 10 or Math Workplace and Apprenticeship 10 is required to move into a 20-level math.
- If you require extra math support, consider taking yearlong math (MFP10Y or MWA10Y)
- Consult with your current math teacher or your Learning Assistance teacher. Yearlong Math takes 2 time slots but is only 1 credit.
- Math classes move onto the next classes in that stream (flow chart coming up).

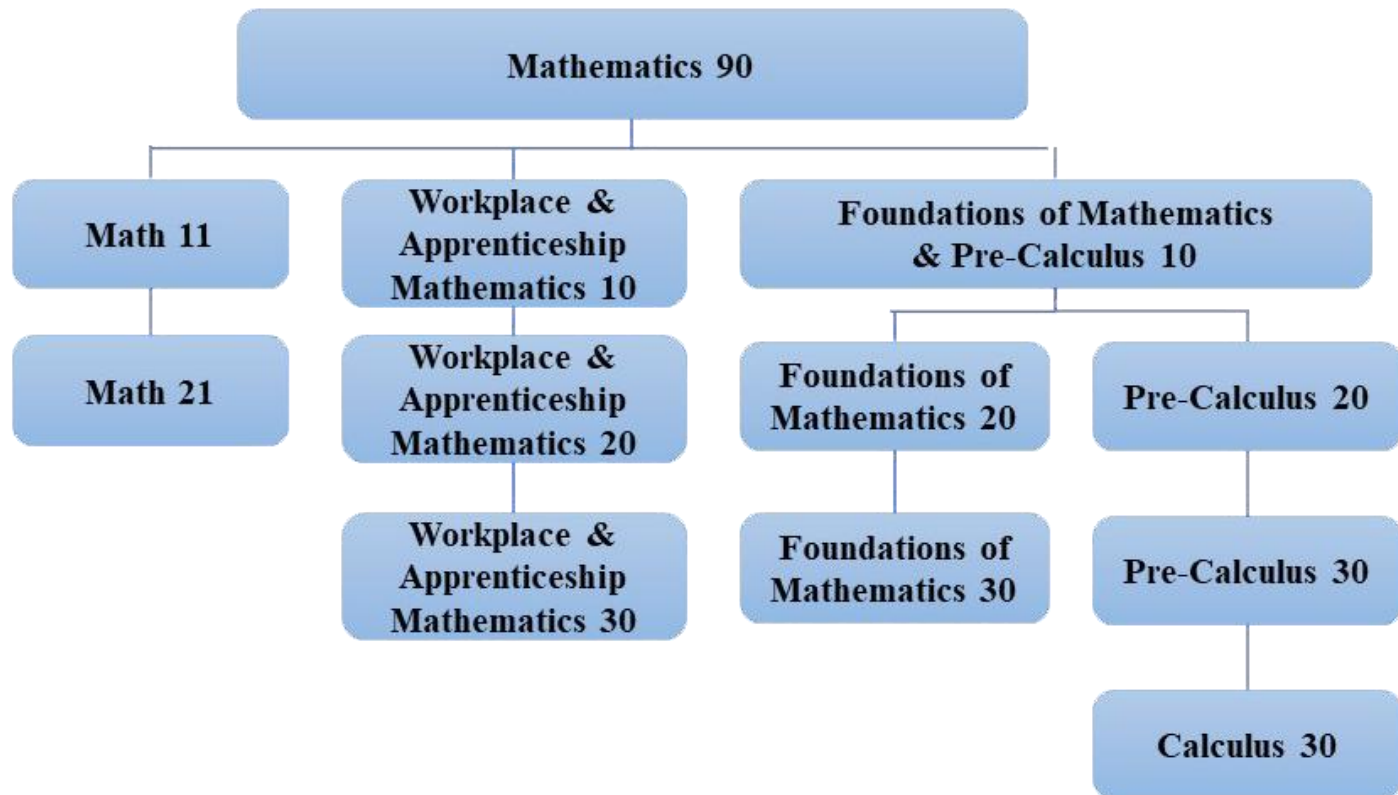
Math Information for Gr. 11

- Grade 10 Students: If you have already taken MFP10 and you require extra Math support, consider taking Math Foundations 20 Yearlong (MFO20Y). This class offers MFO20 over two semesters.
- Consult with your current math teacher or your LAS Teacher
- MFO20Y counts as 2 class selections in your registration process (two spots in timetable).

Math Information for Gr. 11

- It is strongly recommended that when selecting Math programming for Grade 11, that you take Math Foundations 20 (MFO20) **BEFORE** taking Math Precalculus 20 (MPC20).
- There are several important concepts in Math Foundations 20 that need to be covered before students enroll in Math Precalculus 20 to ensure successful completion of the class.
- Please speak with a counsellor or administrator if you have further questions about Grade 11 math programming.

Math Information for French Immersion

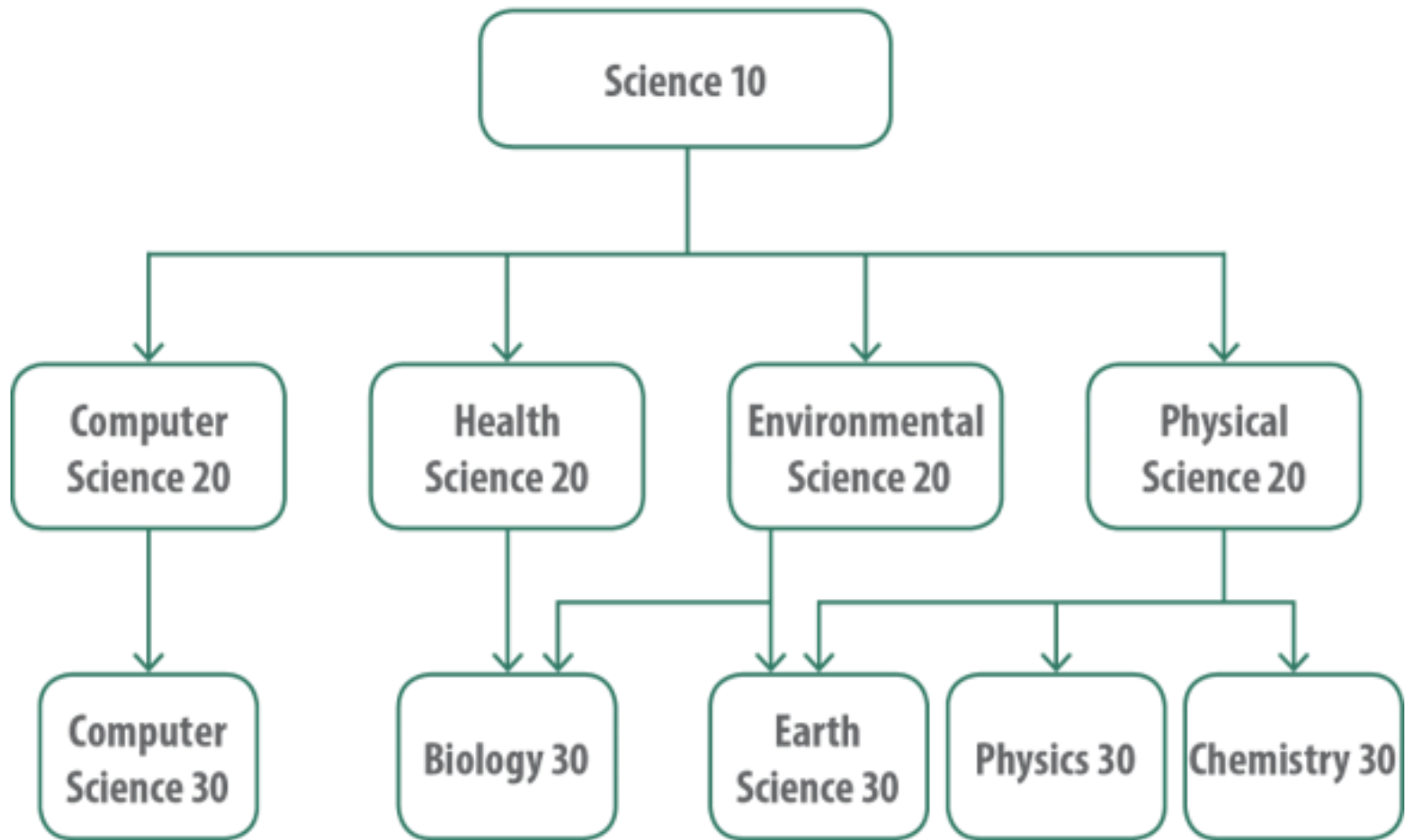
French Immersion students moving into Grade 10 should register for:

- fondements et précalcul des math 10 (MFP10F)

They may also choose to register for:

- Math Foundations 20 – French or English (MFO20F or MFO20)

Special Class Information

Grade 10 BAND

- Those playing brass or percussion – register for BAB10N – Brass.
- Those playing a woodwind instrument – register for BAW10N – Woodwinds.
- Grade 10 Band students sign up for WEL10N.

Special Class Information

Grade 11 BAND

- BAN20N should register for ELA20 and CST20 as normal. One of these courses will alternate with your band class. You cannot pick which. Students who take Band, French Immersion and AP English will need one-semester band. This will be adjusted for you.
- Those playing brass or percussion - select BAB20N or BAB30N – Brass.
- Those playing a woodwind instrument - select BAW20N or BAW30N – Woodwinds.

Special Class Information

Grade 12 Band

- BAN30N select CST30N.
- 30-level French Immersion students may need to take one-semester band.
- Those playing brass or percussion – select BAB30N – Brass.
- Those playing a woodwind - select BAW30N – Woodwinds.

CHOIR 10, 20, 30

- Please note that Choir is an additional class that takes place over lunch hours.
- Students should register for Choir during their online course selection.

ELECTIVES

- There are many electives available to students at the 10 to 30 level to fulfill the 24-credit unit graduation requirement.
- Students may take electives at a higher grade level if they have the necessary pre-requisites (as stated in the registration booklet).

ELECTIVES

- Please note that there are new electives that provide students with two credits.
- Students interested in taking these courses should take note that they must enroll in TWO courses when making their course selections in MSS.

ELECTIVES

- **Outdoor Science 20** – this is a two-credit course. Students interested in taking this course must enroll in Environmental Science 200 (ESC200) and Wildlife & Habit Studies 200 (WHS200)
- **Football 20L/30L** – this is a two-credit credit. Students interested in taking this course must enroll in Football 20L/30L(FTB20L/30L) and the ***Football section*** of Active Living and Fitness Leadership (ALF20LF/30LF).

- **Forensic Science 20 (FSC20)** (prereq. - Grade 10 standing)
- **History 20: Cinematic Warfare (HIS20CW)** (prereq. – History 10, Indigenous Studies 10 or administrative permission)
- **Instrumental Jazz 20 (IJA20)** (prereq. – Instrumental Jazz 10 and/or a co-requisite of Band 20 or Administrative permission) ****This class will run in the morning beginning at 7:30AM. ****
- **Indigenous Mentorship 30L (IME30L)** (prereq. - Grade 10 standing)
- **Journalism Studies 20L (JST20)** (prereq. - Grade 10 standing)

- **Theater Arts 20 (TAR20)** (prereq. - None)

- If you select a required course through cyber school, you should consult with a counselor in Student Services to ensure that you have all required courses.
- You should register for required classes through Holy Cross until the day you receive confirmation of enrollment at Cyber School. Drop your Holy Cross class by visiting Student Services.

Cyber School

- Important information for students considering taking a class through Cyber School:
- Translation tools or AI are not permitted as the primary method of completing coursework, and when used, must be cited correctly.

Cyber School

- To strengthen academic integrity, students may now be randomly selected for proctoring (in person testing) as outlined in the Cyber School registration contract. Proctoring may occur at the home school when possible. Proctored work may include a sample writing task, redoing an assignment, quiz or exam (midterm and/or final), or completing a new task. If there is a discrepancy between your submitted work and your proctored work, further verification may be required.

Cyber School

- If you are English as an additional language learner (EAL), please note you must demonstrate a minimum English proficiency of B1.1 to enrol in a Cyber course.
- If concerns regarding language proficiency arise, proctoring may be administered to determine continued enrolment or the validity of a previous assessment. Additional proctoring may also be applied in French courses to ensure authentic student work

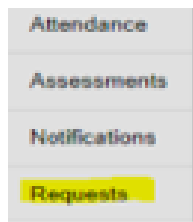

Instructions

Welcome to your course selection for Grade 11.

We recommend that all Grade 11 students have 10 course selections unless you are taking a stretched Math option which counts as 2 classes as it takes up two spots in your timetable, one in each semester.

Compulsory classes that you are required to take in Grade 11 are the following:

- 1) Catholic Studies 20
- 2) English A20
- 3) History 20 or Indigenous Studies 20
- 4) A 20 Level Math (Math Foundations 20, or Math Precalculus 20, or Work and Apprenticeship Math 20)
- 5) A 20 Level Science (Health Science 20, or Physical Science 20, or Environmental Science 20)
- 6) Add 5 elective courses

It is the student's responsibility to ensure they have the pre-requisite to register for the next level course or the credit cannot be granted. Please refer to the Registration Handbook for pre-requisite information.
