## **Jelinski elected to Catholic school board**

*SASKATOON, (Oct. 30, 2014)* – Tim Jelinski is the newest trustee on the Greater Saskatoon Catholic Schools Board of Education. He was elected from a slate of six candidates in the Wednesday, Oct. 29 by-election to fill a vacant Saskatoon seat on the board.

“I’m really honoured to have been chosen to serve on this board,” said Jelinski. “I look forward to working with my colleagues as we work together to strengthen Catholic education.”

Jelinski joins six other Saskatoon trustees on the Board. Three additional Board members represent Biggar, Humboldt, as well as Warman and Martensville and rural areas southeast of Saskatoon.

Jelinski is a former teacher, principal and director of education who spent 28 years with the Prince Albert Catholic school division. He retired in 2011 after 11 years as director there. He is currently a member of the Cathedral of the Holy Family Parish in Saskatoon, where he is active in several ministries and serves on parish council.

“My colleagues and I on the board are eager to welcome Tim. We appreciate his strong support of Catholic education and his expertise as an educator,” says Diane Boyko, chair of the Greater Saskatoon Catholic Schools Board of Education.

“We also thank the five other people who let their names stand for election,” Boyko added. “Their willingness to serve children, families and the wider community as a school board trustee is appreciated.”

Greater Saskatoon Catholic Schools serves approximately 16,650 students.
