# 6.1 Catholic School Community Councils 2023-2024 Engagement Plan

#### Background Information:

Each year, we plan two events to facilitate engagement between our Board of Education and our Catholic School Community Councils (CSCC). As you know, the Provincial government has also identified family engagement as a priority within the new Provincial Education Plan. This aligns with the board's renewed commitment to building relationships and partnerships.

For the 2023-2024 school year, the following Catholic School Community Council Plan is proposed:

- 1. Two Catholic School Community Council/Trustee Meetings
  - Time: 7:00-8:30 p.m.
  - November 15, 2023 at École St. Luke Catholic School
  - May 22, 2024 Location to be determined.

#### 2. CSCC Workshops

- We will provide one or two additional evening workshops to facilitate orientation, training and a networking opportunity for CSCC members.
- CSCC members will be given an opportunity to continue their learning and commitment to Truth and Reconciliation by participating in the online program Four Seasons of Reconciliation. Those who complete the course will be honoured with a certificate of completion.
- CSCC members will be invited to attend a tour and engage in sessions offered by the Saskatoon Family Resource Centre: <a href="https://www.saskatoonfamilycentre.ca/">https://www.saskatoonfamilycentre.ca/</a>.
- CSCC members will have the opportunity to engage in a 6-week faith filled and empowering course Inner Lead Cultivating Awe, Wonder and Joy ...while raising school aged children within a Catholic context.

#### 3. Trustee School Liaison Program

• The appointment of trustees to the Trustee School Liaison Program will be approved at the September board meeting for the 2023-2024 school year.

At Greater Saskatoon Catholic Schools, we strive towards CSCCs that are reflective of the families we serve. This includes continued collaboration with First Nations and Métis families, as well as the more than 600 families who are new to Canada and have recently enrolled in our schools. The insights, experiences, and ideas of all families who choose Catholic Education are invaluable to our CSCCs and we extend a warm welcome for all to participate. Together, we continue the path of reconciliation, remain rooted in faith, grow in knowledge, and reach out to transform the world.

#### Background Information:

In order to help build relationships and understanding for our trustees, we use a rotational program called the Trustee School Liaison Program. Over the course of a trustee's 4-year term, they will have the opportunity to learn about all schools in our division. The program allows them to focus on a smaller group of schools each year. During that year, they get to know more about the school's context, programs, attend school celebrations, etc.

As we do not operate on a Ward System, this program helps to provide trustees with understanding of the system-wide activities and needs. In addition, trustees use this program to attend Catholic School Community Council meetings at the schools in their group of schools.

The schedule for the Trustee School Liaison Program is approved in September of each school year. The recommended schedule for 2023-2024 will be presented at the meeting.

Background Information:

While we continue to mourn the passing of Trustee D. Berscheid, there are some legislated implications that the board needs to attend to.

Trustee Berscheid's passing has created a vacancy for the Humboldt subdivision. According to *The Local Governments Elections Act*, the board must determine how to address the vacancy.

The board has three options: proceed to fill the vacancy through a by-election, permanently collapse the seat, or seek a Minister's Order to operate with the seat vacant until the next general election.

The board has been exploring all of the options available. Should the board determine to collapse the seat, a motion to that effect would need to be approved at this meeting. Should the board determine to move to a by-election, a motion setting the election date would need to be made at this meeting. However, the third option, given the current fiscal context, seems to perhaps have some appeal. This option would keep the seat available for the next election without incurring the costs of a by-election. Should the circumstances of the board change prior to the next election, this decision can be revisited. The board could designate a trustee from another subdivision to be the lead contact for the Humboldt subdivision until the next general election.

#### Recommendation:

That the Board of Education request a Minister's Order to maintain the Humboldt subdivision seat, but leave the position vacant until the next school board election at the latest, provided no other changes occur.



## Director's Report September 11, 2023

Saskatoon Industry Education Council (SIEC) – Summer Youth Internship Program: The wrap-up celebration for this year's Summer Youth Internship Program took place on August 16. Students apply to jobs in the trades with construction, manufacturing and culinary companies. There is an opportunity for high school credits to be earned over the 6-week period. This year SIEC had 60 students in this year's program with 37 companies involved. A sincere thanks to these businesses for opening their doors to students as they learn many important skills for their future. This program is a partnership funded by the government of Saskatchewan along with support from WorkSafe Saskatchewan, Saskatoon Construction Association, Saskatoon Construction Safety Association, and the Saskatchewan Apprenticeship and Trades Certification Commission.

Greater Saskatoon Catholic Schools Foundation – Annual Share the Spirit Golf Tournament: August 15 was the annual Foundation Golf Tournament. It was a sold-out tournament again this year! Golfers enjoyed the round and the opportunity to get together to show their support for Catholic education in our community. We thank the Foundation and all their sponsors for their generosity in supporting the many activities happening at our schools thanks to their involvement. We look forward to new and exciting ventures with the Foundation this year.

**New Teacher Welcome:** Greater Saskatoon Catholic Schools' annual gathering for our new teaching staff took place on August 25. The day brought our new teachers together to review the many supports that are available to help our new teachers through any challenges they may encounter. As well, foundational documents and perspectives to navigate through our online resources were reviewed. Thanks to all who were able to join the group for lunch. We look forward to getting to know our new teachers in the coming year.

**Métis Cultural Days:** On September 7-10 Central Urban Métis Federation Inc. hosted the 6<sup>th</sup> annual Métis Cultural Days. This year, a wide variety of cultural workshops were available to students including braided rug-making, cultural games, beading, and paddle-making for example. As well, a dinner and art auction was held on September 9 as part of the festivities.

**Michif Culture and Language Camp:** From July 31-August 4, Batoche Festival Grounds was home to CUMFI's Michif language camp. With the goals of promoting and revitalizing the Michif language, participants chose to learn either Heritage or Northern Michif through song, music, dance and lessons by language instructors. Additionally, participants were afforded an opportunity to experience some land-based education as they hunted a buffalo!

**Summer Success Program:** This summer, in partnership with Greater Saskatoon Catholic Schools, United Way of Saskatoon and Area delivered six Summer Success Programs in July 2023. Up to 100 children participated in a 2-week summer program to ensure that their reading levels maintained or improved over the summer months.
