

A byelection for a board member to fill one (1) vacant position in Saskatoon for St. Paul's Roman Catholic Separate School Division #20 (Greater Saskatoon Catholic Schools) will be held April 15.

Who can vote?

For a person to be eligible to vote on election day, they must:

- be at least 18 years of age;
- be a Canadian citizen;
- have resided in Saskatchewan for at least six consecutive months;
- be a resident of Saskatoon and have resided within the boundaries of the separate school division for at least three consecutive months; and

- be of the Catholic faith (any Catholic rite, such as Roman, Ukrainian, Chaldean, etc., that recognizes the pope as the leader of the church)

Eligible voters can vote at any of the following locations during the advance poll or on election day.
