# 6.1 Local Implementation Negotiations Committee Agreement

### Background Information:

The current Local Implementation Negotiations Committee (LINC) Agreement is scheduled to expire August 31, 2023 after the 'roll-over' last year.

The Saskatoon Teachers' Association (STA) and LINC executive have once again brought forward the idea of 'rolling over' the agreement for another year. This re-consideration comes primarily from the STA's thorough understanding of the budgetary challenges facing the division.

While we continue to advocate for more stable and reliable funding, the roll-over would secure the terms and conditions for teachers for another year.

The one-year roll-over to the LINC Agreement would see no change to language. However, should something pressing arise, amendments can always be achieved by mutual consent of the parties through letters of understanding.

#### Recommendation:

That the Board of Education approve the roll-over to the current LINC Agreement (set to expire August 31, 2023) for the 2023-2024 school year (expiring August 31, 2024).

#### Background Information:

Greater Saskatoon Catholic Schools' administration was approached by the City of Humboldt Public Works in the summer of 2022 about the City Wide Storm Water Study that identified the low-lying land south of St. Dominic School-Humboldt as a potential dry pond opportunity. Dry ponds are low lying areas of land that connect to the storm water system and intentionally flood during a heavy rainfall event to prevent flooding and damage to properties in the area. Dry ponds typically act as functional green spaces like soccer pitches, football fields, ball diamonds and walking areas. An example would be the dry pond that the city built adjacent to Humboldt Collegiate in Centennial Park. The land located south of St. Dominic is well situated given the issues residents are experiencing in this area of the city.

An easement agreement with the City of Humboldt has been drafted for the land parcel south of the main school site which is approximately 6.6 acres. The following is a summary of the main components of the agreement:

- 1. The lands would be used for the purposes of a dry pond. The City anticipates that it would be 5-10 years before the dry pond would be constructed. If the lands are not developed by the City by December 31, 2038, the school division would retain the right to terminate the easement agreement.
- 2. Any changes to the easement would be done in consultation and approval of all parties.
- 3. The school division would participate in the planning for the dry pond area including any enhancements beyond a grassed area.
- 4. The City of Humboldt would be required to maintain the property.
- 5. The City of Humboldt would be guaranteed access to the lands provided the conditions of agreement are met.

#### Recommendation:

That the Board of Education approve the City of Humboldt's proposed Easement Agreement for the land south of St. Dominic School-Humboldt.



# **Director's Report**

June 12, 2023

#### **Treaty 6 Medal Installations:**

Our schools continue the process of learning about treaties. The learning process begins in the fall and concludes with the action of installing the Treaty 6 Medal in their school. At this time, most of our schools have completed the process. Since our last board meeting, the following schools have completed this action:

#### **Catholic School Community Councils (CSCC) / Trustee Liaison Meeting:**

On May 16, the board hosted members of our CSCCs at St. Kateri Tekakwitha Catholic School. Bishop Mark Hagemoen and Lyndon Linklater co-presented to the group about their journey towards reconciliation. This was a powerful message of solidarity for our families to hear.

CFO Lloyd also presented specific to our current budget funding gap. Parents were engaged in the discussion and were asked to provide feedback specific to our division's advocacy.

# Saskatoon Teachers' Association (STA):

The STA hosted two important socials since our last board meeting: The New Teacher Gathering (May 18) and Educational Partners Gathering (June 7). Particularly for our new teaching staff, the opportunity to gather and provide support to them was greatly appreciated.

#### wāhkōhtowin Gathering:

On May 19, division leadership was able to meet at Wanuskewin Heritage Park and celebrate the long-standing partnership we have with the University of Saskatchewan's Indian Teacher Education Program (ITEP) and Saskatoon Public Schools.

#### **Rotary Club Cheque Presentation:**

On May 30, our division was blessed to receive a cheque for \$20,000 from the Rotary Club as a part of the partnership that was established in 2021. These funds are targeted to the new St. Frances Cree Bilingual School and will support the development of the Indigenous space in the center of the new facility.

#### **Fiddle Fest:**

St. Michael's Métis School of Excellence hosted their annual Fiddle Fest on June 1. This celebration of Métis culture through music is but one example of the amazing work the staff and our partners at Central Urban Métis Federation Inc. (CUMFI) do on a daily basis to ensure Métis culture is vibrant.

## Canadian Catholic School Trustees' Association (CCSTA) Convention and AGM:

The long awaited CCSTA conference hosted by Greater Saskatoon Catholic Schools' Board of Education took place from June 1-3. Trustees from across Canada were treated to thought provoking speakers and a variety of social events that allowed trustees to build relationships and connections. It was a pleasure to be able to celebrate the gift of Catholic education with trustees from all over Canada.

#### **Long Term Service Awards:**

Our long-term service awards were moved to June 5 this academic year. Our Human Resources team organized a wonderful celebration at The Willows Golf and Country Club to pay tribute our staff who have served 25, 30 and 35 years in Catholic education.
