Centered on the theme *Pilgrims of Hope / Pèlerins de l'espérance*, this week invites us to journey together in faith, recognizing our lives as a path shaped by faith, community, and a deepening relationship with Christ. We are called to accompany one another—building relationships rooted in love, peace, and solidarity.

6.3 Granatier Player Academy Memorandum of Understanding (MOU)

Background Information:

Representatives from the Granatier Sports Complex and Greater Saskatoon Catholic Schools have co-developed a player academy for Grade 8 and 9 students. This player academy is for students who are seeking additional development of ice sports such as ice hockey and ringette.

If approved, the Granatier Player Academy will be open to all students who will enroll in a combined Grade 8/9 program. The program participants will attend the entire school year at the <u>Granatier Sports Complex</u> and will be eligible to take other cyber courses offered by Greater Saskatoon Catholic Schools. The Granatier Player Academy will be attached to Bishop James Mahoney High School. The draft MOU ensures the school division will be reimbursed for any unfunded cost.

Administration is seeking board approval of the program and the draft MOU.

The RFT was posted on SaskTenders to satisfy the requirements of the New West Trade Partnership Agreement and the Canadian Free Trade Agreement. The close date was April 17, 2025.

Three tender responses were received ranging from \$215,818.05 to \$389,100 plus GST and PST.

Royal Stewart Limited is recommended to be selected as the successful vendor based on the lowest tender price.

Two tender responses were received ranging from \$380,000 to \$425,500 plus GST and PST.

Peak Mechanical Partnership is recommended to be selected as the successful vendor based on the lowest tendered price.

Director's Report May 5, 2025
