

The Saskatchewan Collaborative Bachelor of Science in Nursing Program High School Admission

Current High School Student

Applicants who are currently enrolled in high school will have their competitive admission average calculated according to the University of Regina's Early Conditional Admission requirements:

- One course in English or French Language Arts (grade 11 or 12)
- One academic Math at the grade 11 or 12 level
- One course from list A below at the grade 11 or 12 level
- One course from list B below at the grade 11 or 12 level
- One other course from list A or list B below at the grade 11 or 12 level
- A maximum of two math courses may be used
- Nursing does not allow use of any list B courses marked with an asterisk* (These have been removed from this list but may appear on other lists available on the University of Regina website)
- Nursing is competitive and requires a minimum grade of 70% in each course

Applicants admitted according to the Early Conditional Admission requirements also must complete final admission subjects (see list below) with a minimum grade of 70% on **each** course.

- English Language Arts A30 * See note 1
- English Language Arts B30 * See note 1
- One of Foundations of Math 30 or Pre-Calculus 30 ** See note 2
- Biology 30
- Chemistry 30

***Note 1:** Applicants may substitute one of Francais Fransaskois A30/B30 or Francais Immersion 30 for English Language Arts A30 or B30. Applicants from Fransaskois and French Immersion programs may also substitute the equivalent subjects taught in French for those listed above.

***Note 2:** Saskatchewan high school students can present math requirements under the new and/or former curriculums. The previous Saskatchewan mathematics courses of Math A30, Math B30, Math C30 or Calculus 30 will be accepted.

Current grade 12 students must submit an early conditional transcript to Saskatchewan Polytechnic by March 1.

Saskatchewan high school students are required to have their transcripts **sent electronically**; these can be submitted online at <https://www.k12.gov.sk.ca/etranscript/>.

It is recommended that Saskatchewan students select the option to have the transcript sent to “Saskatchewan Polytechnic” ASAP, and “After January Exams 2017” AND “After June Exams 2017”.

Admission to the SCBScN is competitive, therefore only students with the highest admission average will be selected.
